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Madrid, March 14.

**C**ount Mansfeldt, the Emperor's Ambassador, having informed the King that several Princes and States of the Empire, had resolved to meet by their Deputies at *Ausburgh*, to treat upon what had been proposed by the States of *Franconia*, for their mutual Defence and Security, his Catholick Majesty has named the *Sieur de Neufgorges*, his Deputy at the Dyet at *Ratisbonne*, to assist on his part at the said Conference. Orders have been sent to *Cadix*, to hasten the Equipage of the Men of War which are to go and meet the Galeons, and a Sum of Money has been sent thither for that Service. *Don Joseph de Faria*, late Envoy Extraordinary from the King of *Portugal* at the Court of *England*, is come to reside here in the same Quality, in the place of *Don Mendo de Pereyra*, who has had his Audiences of Leave. The Decrees for the great Reform which the King has resolved to make in the several Councils, &c. are not yet published.

*Warsaw*, March 8. The Letters from the Frontiers inform us, that some *Polish* Troops defeated about ten days ago, a Convoy of 200 Wagons laden with Ammunition, which the *Turks* were carrying to *Caminiec*, and killed and took many of the *Turks* prisoners; but that the *Bassa* of *Caminiec* having notice of it, sent out a party of that Garison, who coming up with the *Poles*, charged them, and exceeding them very much in number, obliged them to abandon their Booty, and to retire in great disorder; and that upon this news Orders were sent to the *Sieur Laska*, who commanded a party of *Poles* on that side to joyn with *Mobila* General of the *Cossacks*, and to pursue the Enemy. These Letters add, that five persons who were Spies for the *Turks*, having been lately taken, confessed that they had been in all the Frontier places of this Kingdom, and even at *Leopol*, to observe what Preparations were making for the Campaign, as well as the Situation and strength of the said places. The King is still at *Zalkiew*; The Express he sent to *Rome* is come back, with fresh assurances that the Pope will further assist his Majesty with very considerable Supplies, to enable him to support the Expences of the Campaign. The Letters from *Moscow* say, the Ambassadors of this Crown were very well received there, and that the Czars had appointed some of their chief Ministers to treat with them.

*Vienna*, March 19. The 14th instant arrived were an Express from *Upper Hungary*, with the News that General *Caprara* was before *Montgatx*; And that the King of *Poland* had sent to give him notice that the *Tatars* were marching in a great Body towards *Hungary*. The 17th we had an ac-

count by a second Express, that Count *Caraffa* had joyned General *Caprara* with 800 Horse, 2000 Foot, and eight pieces of Cannon, and six Millions of *Tatars*, and that they had begun to batter the Castle of *Montgatx*. The advice of the march of the *Tatars* is confirmed from several hands; We are told they are commanded by *Sulran Galga*, and that they take their march through *Moldavia* and *Valachia*, with a design, as it's thought, to joyn with the *Turks* for the relief of *Montgatx*. The Count *de Herberstein*, Lieutenant-Colonel of the Regiment of *Strafaldo*, who was taken by the Rebels some years ago, and has been ever since a Prisoner at *Montgatx*, is exchanged for two *Hungarian* Officers of that Garison, who were lately taken in the *Sally* they made. The *Bassa* of *Great Waradin* has caused 16 Officers of the Garison of *St. Job* to be strangled, for making no better defence than they did. Count *Caraffa* has put into that place a Garison of 800 Men, and has set several hundred Men on work to repair the Fortifications. We have advice that Count *Teckley* having got together about 800 *Hungarians*, is gone with them from *Great Waradin* to the *Turkish* Camp between *Gyula* and *Lippa*, where they have about 8000 Men, but that he is so closely observed, that he may not write or speak but in the presence of two Officers, who are appointed to accompany him wherever he goes. The Duke of *Lorraine* is expected here in ten days or a fortnight; and in the mean time the Preparations for the Campaign are carried on with all the diligence and application imaginable. The Regiments appointed to serve in *Hungary*, are 26 of Foot, *viz.* those of Count *Ernest de Staremberg*, *Lesley*, *Keyserlin*, *Bade*, *Mansfeldt*, *Maximilian de Staremberg*, *Schermy*, *Croy*, *Salm*, *la Vergne*, *Stadel*, *Scherfemberg*, *Souches*, *Meternich*, *Diepenbal*, *Thun*, *Neubourg*, *Wallis*, *Becke*, *Aspremont*, *Nigrelli*, *Heusser*, *Lorraine*, *Hontschin*, *Furstenberg* and *Spinola*, making together 38600 Men; 19 Regiments of Horse, *viz.* of *Saxe Lawembourg*, *Caprara*, *Dunewaldt*, *Palfi*, *Caraffa*, *Gondola*, *Taffi*, *Mercy*, *Montecuculi*, *Veserani*, *Piccolomini*, *Heusser*, *Neubourg*, *Gotz*, *Hanouer*, *Furstenberg*, *Platz*, *Truchs*, and another, making 15200 Men; 8 Regiments of Dragoons, of *Schultz*, *Dupin*, *Cassel*, *Serau*, *Herbeville*, *Savoy*, *Dafoni*, and *Magni*, making 6400; and 2 Regiments of *Groats* of *Keri* and *Lodron*, making 2000; The Auxiliary Troops of *Saxony* will be 4000; those of *Bavaria* 8000; those of *Brandenburg* 7000; those of *Franconia* and *Swabia* 8000; and those of the Circle of the *Upper Rhine* 3600: All these Forces together amount to 92800 Men. It is said that the Elector of *Brandenburg* has promised the Emperor 1200 Men, besides those for which his Imperial Majesty has treated with him. There are private Letters from *Buda* of the 3 Instant, which confirm what our former advices said of the Grand Viziers Resolution to bring the *Ottoman* Forces that served the
