ART. I. That so much of the aforesaid Act as relates to the appointment of a vestry clerk shall forthwith be applied to, and be put in force within, the said parish of Hesket-in-the-Forest.

ART. 2. That a copy of this order shall be published in the London Gazette.

The Brighton District Water Company.

OTICE is hereby given, that application will be made in the ensuing session of Parliament for leave to bring in a Bill, intituled "An Act for providing a constant supply of water in the parishes of Brighthelmstone, Preston, and Hove, in the eastern division of the county of Sussex," by which Bill it is intended to incorporate a Company, to be called "The Brighton District Water Company," for the purpose of making, maintaining, varying, extending, and enlarging waterworks, laying, lifting, and repairing pipes for the distribution of water, distributing water, and generally doing all things authorised by "The Waterworks Clauses Act, 1847," "The Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," and "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," all places within certain prescribed limits; that is to say: within the parishes of Brighthelmstone, Preston, and Hove, in the eastern division of the county of Sussex; and it is intended that "The Waterworks Clauses Act, 1847," "The Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," and "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," shall be incorporated with and be held to form part of the said Bill; and it is intended by the said Bill to apply for power to levy rates within the said prescribed limits in payment for the supply of water to be provided by the said Company; and it is intended by the said Bill to apply for powers for the compulsory purchase of lands and houses, in the parishes of Brighthelmstone, Preston, and Hove, for the purpose of making, maintaining, varying, extending, and enlarging the proposed waterworks. And it is intended that the said waterworks shall consist of the following works; that is to say: a well or wells, with a pumping steam engine or steam engines, at a point in the parish of Preston, at or near the viaduct whereby the Lewes and Hastings Branch of the London, Brighton, and South-Coast Railway is carried over the turnpike-road from Brighton to Cuckfield: a reservoir at a point in the parish of Preston at or near the west end of the tunnel whereby the said Lewes and Hastings Branch of the London, Brighton, and South-Coast Railway is carried through Round Hill: a second reservoir at a point in the parish of Preston at or near the point where the road from Brighton to Henfield crosses the road from Blatchington to the village of Preston: a main pipe in the parish of Preston, having one terminus at the before-mentioned proposed well or wells in the parish of Preston, at or near the viaduct whereby the Lewes and Hastings Branch of the London, Brighton, and South-Coast Railway is carried over the turnpike-road from Brighton to Cuckfield, and the other terminus at the first-mentioned proposed reservoir in the parish of Preston, at or near the west end of the tunnel whereby the Lewes and Hastings Branch of the London, Brighton, and South-Coast Railway is carried through Round Hill: a second main pipe in the parishes of Preston and Brighthelmstone, having one terminus at the said proposed well or wells in the parish of Preston, at or near the viaduct whereby the Lewes and Hastings Branch of the London, Brighton, and South-Coast Railway is carried over the turnpike-road from Brighton to Cuckfield, and the other terminus at a point in the parish of Brighthelmstone, at or near the point where the boundary between the parishes of Preston and Brighthelmstone crosses the turnpike-road from Brighton to Cuckfield: a third main pipe in the parishes of Brighthelmstone, Preston, and Hove, having one terminus in the parish of Preston, at the said proposed well or wells, at or near the viaduct whereby the Lewes and Hastings Branch of the London, Brighton, and South-Coast Railway is carried over the turnpike road from Brighton to Cuckfield, and the other terminus at a point in the parish of Brighthelmstone, at or near the west end of the tunnel whereby the Portsmouth Branch of the London, Brighton, and South-Coast Railway is carried under the road from Brighton to Henfield: A fourth main pipe in the parish of Preston, having one terminus at the second mentioned proposed reservoir in the parish of Preston, at or near the point where the road from Brighton to Henfield crosses the road from Blatchington to the village of Preston, and the other terminus at a junction with the third proposed main pipe at a point in the parish of Preston at or near the point

where the boundary between the parishes of Preston and Hove intersects the road from Brighton to Henfield; and the works above described are intended to be made, maintained, varied, extended, and enlarged from, in, through, and into the parishes of Brighthelmstone, Preston, and Hove, all in the eastern division of the county of Sussex.
