## Marfeilles , April 9.

• HE Duke de Mortemar is arrived at Toulon, to command the Ships now fitting there, which may be feady to fail in 15 days, being 18 Men of War, and 4 Fireshipe; They are to join with T5 Men of War more from Welt-

France. This day arrived here a Bark from Cadiz, the Mafter reports, that ther' are about 20 'Sail of Algierines abroad, hree or four whereof carry 50 Guins and upwards ; And that they have broke with the Dutch, having taken about the Streights Mouth a Dutch Flyboat, and carried her to Argiers.

Vienna, March 28. 'The last Letters from the Camp before Montgasz inform us, that they 'had finished their Lines of Circumvallation and Batteries, and had begun to attack the place with their Cannon and 1 ombs, which, especially the Litter , had already caufed a Confernation among the Belieged; That the Beliegers directed their Attack against the Lower Town, which is fortified with a good Wall, and feveral Redoubts, with a double Dutch, very deep, and fall of water; And hoped, notwithftan ing they made their Approaches with much difficulty, to be in few days Malters of it, and till then they would not begin their Attack againit the Calife or Upper Town, which flands on a Rock, and is in a manner inacceffible but on the fide of the Lower Town; The Belieged had made feveral Sallies, and the Pri-Toners that have been taken, fay, they are refolved to defend the place to the laft extremity. From Zoluosks we have an account, that the Seralquier Achmet Baffa was marched with the Body he had drawn together towards Gynla, and that Lieutenant-General de Mercy was gone with 6000 Men to meet and fight him, They write from Carelftade of the 15th of the laft Month, that the Count de Sirajo'do, Governor of that place, ha-ving fent out Colonel Orfebie with 1200 Men, ro make an Incursion into the Enemies Territorics, they advanced as far as the Little Town of Tudorow, which they took by Affault, putting, during the heat of it, all the Turks they found in Arass to the Sword; After which, they plundered and burntsche Town, and returned to Carellade with a rich Booty, and 200 Valdques, who had put thema | felves into the Emperor's Service. We have like-

private Letters from Buda fay, that the chief In-genier, who affilted in the defence of that place in the year 1583, was again expected there, and that the Vifier of Buda did all he could to furnili the place with Ammunition and Provisions, fearing another Siege this Summer. The Edvoys of Than-floanda have not yet received the Ratification of the late Treaty they concluded here ; And there is reason to believe that Prince Abafti has taken new measures since the arrival at his Court of a Chiaus from the Grand Signiot, who, we Hear, has made him great promiles, and has obtained passage for 10000 Tartars through his Countrey. The Emperor has lately given the Count de Peterbasi, who commands the Hungarians in his Imperial Majeflits Service, a confiderable Effate in Bungary. The Baron de Becke is made Governor of Philipsburg, in the place of Count Maximilian de Staremberg, who, with the Emperor's leave, is goue into the Service of the Elector Palatin', to command his Forces, and to be Prefident of his Council of War.

War. Vienna, March 31. The Dure of Lorrain is expected here from Infprucke in few days, to affift at a great Council of War that will be held in the prefence of his Imperial Majelty; and, it's believed, his Highdel's will be going about the middle of the next Month for Hungary, where in the mean time, all things are preparing for the opening of the Campagne. The Couut Cziaki, the Emperor's Refident at the Court of Pokend, a r. ved here the laft week; He has had Audichce of the Emperor; and feveral Conferences with the Ministers, and wifi, it's faid, be very fuddenly fent back to Poland. We have advice, that a Detachement from Sigetb and Canifa made the 17th instant ad Incuring into the 'Country of Lembleb, from whence they carried about 60 Prifoners, and lome Cattle. The Rebels in Montgatz make a very delperate defence, being encouraged by the allutances they have from Teckeley of a speedy Relief. They have made feve-ral Sallies, in which some Men have been killed on both fides; The soft inftant the Befiegers begin to batter the Lower Town from three Batteries, and had then loft in their Trenches 22 Men, belides fy or 16 wounded. Rativbonne, April 6. The Letters from Vienna of the 31 of the last Month tell us, that Montgatz was formally befieged, but that it was like to prove an Enterp ize of great difficulty, the place being very flrong, and provided with all things necessary for its defence. That the Deputies of Transilvania had made g cat complaints to the Emperor's Minifters of the Ravage they pretend, the Imperial Troops have made in that Countrey, with an intimation that the States of Transilvania were unwilling to ratify the Treaty lately concluded at Fienna, until they were in fome measure caled of the great Burthen they lie under. But these Complaints seem to be made at this time by the Prince and States of Transfluenta, only to excuse the delay of the Ratifications of the faid Treaty, and to gain time till the iffue of the Siege of Montgatz may direct them, with whom to perfect the Treaties they have now on foot, with the Imperialifts or the Turks.

Hamburgh, April 5. The differences between the Duke of Zell and this City have retarded the march of the Troops of Brandenburgh and Saxony towards Hungary, but it's hoped they will now be very fuddenly composed, by the Interpolition of the Baron Horwart and the Baron de Goedens the Imperial Commissioners, who are daily expected here. The Elector of Brandenburgh does likewife employ, his Mediation for this purpole, and bas propoled to these Magisfrates, as an Expedient, to fend a Deputation to the Duke of Zell, undertaking, that fo foon as they enter within the Territories of that Prince, his Troops shall retire out of the Territories of this City, upon which we do not yet hear what refolution they have taken. They write from Copenbagen, that the 12 Frigats that are fitting out there, were almost ready to fail. We are told from Sueden, that they are likewife fitting a Squadron of Mon of War in that Kingdom.

*Hague*, April 6. The 2d Infant the Deputies from the Province of Zealand, Seven in number, had Audience of the States of Holland, to which they were conducted with much Ceremony, and have fince been in Conference with the Deputies of the faid States. The Deputics of the States General had a Conference the 30th of the last Month, and another the 4th Instant with the Count d'A vanx Amballador from France, Licutenant-Gencral Space is gone back to Cleves. Prince Waldecke, and the Count of Naffau are likewife parted from hence, the first for Kurjemburg, and the other for Breda.

Bruffels, April 134. Count Salazar intended to have parted from hence yellerday for England, buthe isfallen ill again of the Gout. The sth In-flant the Sieur Blanche, Greffier of the Stares of Brabass, was feized, and carried the pext day Prifonce under a Guard of as Horfemen to the Caffle of Leeuwe, The Letters from Fienne of the 31 past lay, that the Prince of Transivania' had not only granted the Tartans a pallage through his Countrey, and promifed to supply them with Provisions in their march, but was privately treating

About Ilford Comb, abundance of Almonds is caft afhore; and the Mafters of fome Veifels that came from Ireland report, that they faw in the Changel a great many Casks floating on the Sea, but the weather was fo tempestuous that they could not put out their Boats to take them up. And by feveral Veffels that are arrived here from Scilly, we are inform'd, that the Princefs of Rotterdam, a very great Ship bound for the Eaft-Indies, was lately call away there, and all the Men drown-ed. Our Firginia Ships are not yet arrived.
