Downing-Street, December 11, 1851.

The Queen has been pleased to appoint Robert Duncan Wilmot, Esq. to be Surveyor-General for the Province of New Brunswick.

tively, within which ships, lighters, barges, boats, and other vessels are by virtue of the said Acts respectively under the power, authority, or control of the Dock-masters, or other persons, in the said Acts respectively mentioned); and for the better governing and regulating of all masters of vessels, pilots, lightermen, and others within the said port (except as before excepted), and for the other purposes mentioned in the said Act, and such other lawful and reasonable bye-laws, rules, orders, and regulations as they should deem necessary and expedient for the due execution of the therein recited Act of the thirty-ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, and the said Act of the tenth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth now in recital, so as the same respectively were not contrary to or inconsistent with the therein recited Acts, or any of them, or the said Act now in recital, or any of the regulations enacted thereby or by any other Act or Acts of Parliament in force at or immediately before the passing of the said Act now in recital and not thereby repealed or altered, or contrary to or inconsistent with the laws of that part of the United Kingdom called England; and also, from time to time as they should see occasion, to repeal, annul, add to, amend, and alter such bye-laws, rules, orders, and regulations, or any of them, in such manner as to them, the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons in Common Council assembled, should seem meet or requisite, and to fix and appoint reasonable pecuniary penalties, not exceeding ten pounds, for the non-observance, non-performance, or other breach of such bye-laws, rules, orders, and regulations, or any of them:

Council assembled: And whereas, by a certain Act of Parliament, passed in the second year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to continue for seven years an Act for regulating the vend and delivery of coals in London and Westminster, and in certain parts of the adjacent counties," it was enacted (amongst other things) that, within three calendar months next after the passing of the said last-mentioned Act, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the city of London in Common Council assembled should, and they were thereby required to make such bye-laws as should be necessary for regulating or removing vessels laden with coals, and otherwise remedying the inconveniences caused to the navigation of the said port of London, in consequence of the collection of large numbers of vessels laden with coals in different parts of the said port as therein mentioned, and should from time to time alter and vary such bye-laws as should be necessary:

And whereas, within three calendar months next after the passing of the said last-mentioned Act of Parliament of the second year of the reign of Her present Majesty, and in pursuance and under the authority of the same, certain bye-laws, rules,

orders, and regulations for regulating and removing vessels laden with coals in and near the port of London, and otherwise remedying the inconveniences caused to the navigation of the said port, in consequence of the collection of large numbers of vessels laden with coals in different parts of the said port, were made, ordained, and established, on the twenty-first day of August, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight, by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the city of London, in Common Council assembled:

And whereas, by a certain Act of Parliament, passed in the ninth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to continue, until the fifth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, the Acts for regulating the vend and delivery of coals in London and Westminster, and in certain parts of the adjacent counties," it was enacted (amongst other things) that the above-mentioned Act of the second year of the reign of Her present Majesty, and all the powers, authorities, directions, provisions, penalties, forfeitures, regulations, clauses, matters, and things therein contained (except such of them, or such parts thereof respectively as were repealed, altered, or otherwise provided for) should be, and the same were thereby continued until the fifth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two:

And whereas the powers and authorities given by the said Act of the second year of Her present Majesty to the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the city of London in Common Council assembled to make such bye-laws as therein mentioned, and from time to time to alter and vary such bye-laws as should be necessary, have not in any way been lawfully repealed, altered, or other-

wise provided for:

And be it further ordained and established by the authority aforesaid, that the master, or other person having the command, management, or charge of any ship or vessel, laden or partly laden with coals, which shall come into the said port of London, shall, before proceeding with such ship or vessel above or to the westward of Gravesend, obtain from the Harbour-master's office, at Gravesend an order (signed by the Harbour-master on duty at that station, such order being printed or written or partly printed and partly written), directing such master or other person as aforesaid to proceed to such section, berth, or

station for colliers on the said river Thames, between Gravesend and Blackwall, as shall be assigned to or appointed for such ship or vessel by the said order; and such ship or vessel shall be described or designated in the said order by a number to be inserted in the said order by the said Harbour-master; and such master or other • person as first aforesaid shall, upon receiving such order, forthwith with his said ship or vessel proceed to and anchor, moor, or place his said ship or vessel in the section, berth, or station so appointed for or assigned to his said ship or vessel in the said order as aforesaid; and such master or other person as aforesaid shall also, upon receiving such order, forthwith write or cause to be written in a legible and conspicuous manner upon each bow of such ship or vessel, and in figures of not less than one foot in length and of a proportionate width, the number by which such ship or vessel is so designated or described in the said order as aforesaid, and such master or other person as aforesaid shall keep and continue the said figures so legibly written upon each bow of such ship or vessel as aforesaid until the ship or vessel shall be unloaded or discharged; and that no such ship or vessel shall be removed from the section, berth, or station which shall be so assigned to or appointed for such ship or vessel as aforesaid, without permission for that purpose first had and obtained from the Harbour-masters of the said port of London, or some or one of them, such permission to be printed or written or partly printed and partly written. And in case any master, or other person having the command, management, or charge of any ship or vessel, laden or partly laden with coals, shall proceed with such ship or vessel above or to the westward of Gravesend, without having obtained from the Harbour-master on duty at Gravesend such order as aforesaid; or in case any master or other person as aforesaid shall not, upon receiving such order, forthwith proceed with his said ship or vessel unto, and anchor, moor, or place his said ship or vessel, in the section, berth, or station so appointed for or assigned to such ship or vessel in the said order as aforesaid; or in case any master or other person as aforesaid shall not, upon receiving such order, forthwith write or cause to be written in a legible and conspicuous manner upon each bow of the said ship or vessel, and in figures of the dimensions aforesaid, the number by which the said ship or vessel is designated or described in the said order as aforesaid, or does not keep and continue the same so legibly and conspicuously written on each bow of the said ship or vessel until the said ship or vessel shall have been unloaded or discharged; or in case any master or other person as aforesaid shall remove such ship or vessel from the section, berth, or station which shall have been so assigned to or appointed for such ship or vessel as aforesaid, without such permission for that purpose first had and obtained from the said Harbour-masters, or some or one of them as aforesaid, such master or other person as aforesaid shall for every such offence forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding ten pounds.

3. And be it ordained and established by the authority aforesaid, that, in every case where any ship or vessel, laden or partly laden with coals as aforesaid, shall have been duly permitted as aforesaid to remove from any such section, berth, or station which shall have been so first assigned to or appointed for such ship or vessel as aforesaid to any other section, berth, or station, or from any section, berth, or station to which such ship or vessel shall have been duly removed to any other section, berth, or station, every such master, or

other person having the command, management, or charge of any such ship or vessel, shall, upon receiving any such order to remove, forthwith with his said ship or vessel proceed to and anchor, moor, or place his said ship or vessel in the section, berth, or station appointed for or assigned to his said ship or vessel in such lastmentioned order for removal as aforesaid; and that every such ship or vessel shall remain at such altered section, berth, or station until the said ship or vessel shall be unloaded or discharged, or duly permitted to remove to some other section, berth, or station as aforesaid. And in case any master or other person so having the command, management, or charge of any such ship or vessel as aforesaid shall not, upon receiving any such order to remove, forthwith proceed to, and anchor, moor, or place his said ship or vessel in the section, berth, or station so appointed for or assigned to his said ship or vessel, in such order for removal as last aforesaid; or in case any such ship or vessel shall not remain at such altered section, berth, or station until his said ship or vessel shall be unloaded or discharged, or be again permitted to remove to some other section, berth, or station in manner and form aforesaid, such master or other person as aforesaid shall for every such offence forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding ten pounds.

4. And be it further ordained and established by the authority aforesaid, that at such times and so often as it shall seem expedient to the Harbourmaster on duty at Gravesend that no more ships or vessels, laden or partly laden with coals, should for the time being proceed above or to the westward of Gravesend, then and in such case the said Harbour-master shall cause a flag or lamp to be conspicuously exhibited and displayed at some convenient place and distance below the said section, berth, or station, No. 7, situate from below the entrance of the Thames and Medway Canal, to Shorn Mead Battery, on the south side of the said river, such place and distance being such as that every master, or other person having the command, management, or charge of any such ship or vessel, may be afforded a reasonable time to moor and anchor his said ship or vessel at such lastmentioned section, berth, or station as aforesaid; and the said Harbour-master shall keep and continue the said flag or lamp so exhibited and displayed during all such time as such Harbourmaster shall deem it expedient to prevent any more such ships or vessels from proceeding above or to the westward of Gravesend. And if any master or other person having the command, management, or charge of any such ship or vessel as aforesaid shall, at any time while such flag or lamp is exhibited as aforesaid, proceed higher up the said river than the said section, berth, or station No. 7, at Higham Bight, without permission for that purpose first had and obtained from the said Harbour-master, such permission to be printed or written or partly printed and partly written, such master or other person as aforesaid shall for every such offence forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding ten pounds.

5. And be it further ordained and established by the authority aforesaid, that no ship or vessel, laden or partly laden with coals, shall under any circumstances, without a written or printed or partly written and partly printed order or consent for that purpose, first had and obtained from one of the said Harbour-masters, remain or continue in any of the tiers between London-bridge and Limehouse Hole, or in any other tier in any other part of the said river and within the said port, for a longer period than fifteen days next after such ship or vessel shall have entered

any such tier, exclusive of the day of entering the same. And if any master, or other person having the command, management, or charge of any such ship or vessel as aforesaid, shall cause or permit such ship or vessel to remain or continue in or at any such tier as aforesaid for a longer period than the said period of fifteen days next after such ship or vessel shall have entered such tier, exclusive of the day of entering the same, without having first obtained such order or consent as aforesaid for that purpose, such master or other person as aforesaid shall, for every such offence, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding ten pounds.

And be it further ordained and established by the authority aforesaid, that every ship or vessel, laden or partly laden with coals as aforesaid, admitted into any tier in any part of the said river within the said port, shall go out of and remove from such tier at the next succeeding flood-tide after the cargo of coals in such ship or vessel shall have been discharged, and shall forthwith proceed to such berth or station as shall be for that purpose appointed by the said Harbour-masters, or either of them. And if any master, or other person having the command, management, or charge of any such ship or vessel shall cause or permit the same to remain or continue in any such tier as aforesaid after the flood-tide next succeeding the period at which the cargo of coals in such ship or vessel shall have been discharged, or shall not, after removing out of such tier, forthwith proceed to such section, berth, or station as shall be for that purpose appointed as aforesaid, such master or other person as aforesaid shall, for every such offence, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding ten pounds. And the said Harbour-masters are, and each of them is, hereby authorized and required, in case of any such ship or vessel not being so removed as aforesaid, within the time aforesaid, to remove the same from such tier as aforesaid, and to take and place the same in such section, berth, or station, as shall be for that purpose appointed; and the expenses of so removing and placing such ship or vessel shall be charged to and be recovered and be recoverable from the owner or owners of the said ship or vessel, or from the master, or other person having, at the time of such removal or placing, the command, management, or charge of the said ship or vessel, to the use of the said Mayor and Commonalty and Citizens of the city of London, in and by the same manner and means as penalties by this bye-law are recoverable.

Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall extend or be deemed or construed to prevent any ship or vessel, laden or partly laden with coals, from proceeding directly and without delay, into any dock, canal, or creek, or to any wharf within the said port, for the purpose of discharging the cargo of such ship or vessel in such dock, canal, or creek, or at such wharf.

7. And be it further ordained and established by the authority aforesaid, that in case the master, or other person having the command, management, or charge of any ship or vessel, laden or partly laden with coals, shall proceed up the said river within the said port for the alleged purpose of discharging the cargo of coals of such ship or vessel in any dock, canal, or creek, or at any wharf, and shall not proceed directly and without delay into such dock, canal, or creek, or to such wharf, such master or other person as aforesaid, shall for every such offence forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding ten pounds.

Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall extend or be construed to extend to abrogate or repeal any of the said bye-laws, rules, orders, and regulations, made, ordained, and established on the thirteenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, so far as the same may be varied or altered by, or be in any way inconsistent with, these present bye-laws, rules, orders, and regulations.

8. Provided also, that nothing herein contained shall extend or be construed to extend to affect any of the rights or privileges belonging to the Corporation of the Trinity-house of Deptford Strond, or to prejudice any of the rights, interests, privileges, franchises, or authority of the Lord Mayor of the city of London for the time being, or to defeat or alter any power, authority, or jurisdiction which he may or otherwise might lawfully claim, use, or exercise, as Conservator of the river of Thames and waters of Medway, but the same are severally excepted therefrom.
