COCOA, TEA, RICE, TOBACCO, SOAP,  
MUSTARD, PEPPER, PEAS, and LEMON

*THE Commissioners for executing the office of  
Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom  
of Great Britain and Ireland do hereby give notice,  
that, on Friday the 26th instant, at one o'clock,  
they will be ready to treat with such persons  
as may be willing to contract for supplying and  
delivering into Her Majesty's Victualling Stores  
at Deptford, the undermentioned articles; viz.:*

Wheat, 3000 quarters; half to be delivered in  
two weeks, and the remainder in two weeks  
afterwards, or any greater portion, or the  
whole, at any earlier period.

Rum (the produce of the British Possessions  
in the West Indies), 25,000 gallons; half to  
be delivered in two weeks, and the remainder  
in two weeks afterwards, or any greater por-  
tion, or the whole, at any earlier period.

Rum (the produce of other British Possessions),  
25,000 gallons; half to be delivered in two  
weeks, and the remainder in two weeks after-  
wards, or any greater portion, or the whole,  
at any earlier period.

Sugar (Muscovado), 100 tons; half to be de-  
livered in two weeks, and the remainder in  
two weeks afterwards, or any greater portion,  
or the whole, at any earlier period.

Cocoa, 100 tons; half to be delivered in two  
weeks, and the remainder in two weeks after-  
wards, or any greater portion, or the whole,  
at any earlier period.

Tea (Congou), 50,000 lbs.; half to be de-  
livered in two weeks, and the remainder in  
two weeks afterwards, or any greater portion,  
or the whole, at any earlier period.

Rice, 25 tons; half to be delivered in two  
weeks, and the remainder in two weeks  
afterwards, or any greater portion, or the  
whole, at any earlier period.

Tobacco (Virginia), 15 tons; half to be de-  
livered in two weeks, and the remainder in  
two weeks afterwards, or any greater portion,  
or the whole, at any earlier period.

Soap (Mottled), 40 tons; half to be delivered  
in two weeks, and the remainder in two  
weeks afterwards, or any greater portion, or  
the whole, at any earlier period.

Mustard (in flour), 10 tons; half to be de-  
livered in two weeks and the remainder in  
two weeks afterwards, or any greater portion,  
or the whole, at any earlier period.

Pepper (whole black), 7 tons; half to be de-  
livered in two weeks, and the remainder in  
two weeks afterwards, or any greater portion,  
or the whole, at any earlier period.

Peas, 500 quarters; half to be delivered in  
two weeks, and the remainder in two weeks  
afterwards, or any greater portion, or the  
whole, at any earlier period.

Lemon Juice, 12,000 gallons; half to be de-  
livered in two months, and the remainder in  
a month afterwards, or any greater portion,  
or the whole, at any earlier period.

The rum, sugar, cocoa, tea, rice, tobacco, and  
pepper, to be exempted from the Customs'  
duties, and the Excise drawback will be allowed  
on the soap.
