The 16th past, the whole Gardon Thewed them selves upon the Walls with their Colours, and with the noise of Trumpets, Drume, and Hauthois, and faluced the Imperialists with three Vollies scoth their Cannon and Mulquets. On the other fide, the Besiegers have finished their Lines of Oircumvalla tion, and have Keured them with feveral Redoubles The 19th of the last Month, they began to batter the Palanque that covers the lower Town from ing to the present state of the Forces, those of two Batteries, and the next day to shoot Bourbs

and Carcaffes into the place, with which they hope to force the Besieged to have recourse to the Empereur's Clemency. The last Letters faid, the Rebels had filled a House in the Palanque with earth, and had planted there two pieces of Cannon, which very much incommoded the Besi gers, who were therefore raising a Battery to difmount the faid Cannon. Lieutenant General de Mercy, and Major General Heuster, have posted themselves with the Body under their Command near the Teysse to observe the Turks, who continue encamped between Gyula and Lippa, expecting the Tartars, and the other Troops that are on their march, to join them. The Visier of Buda hath pur a great Convoy of Provisions into Agria. A Party of Turks of the Garisons of Sigesh and Canifa, having the last week passed the Rabnitz, and made an Incursion into the Country of Lemback, where they took about 60 persons that were working in the Vineyards, and some Cattle; .The Count de Budiani upon notice of it marched with his Heydukes, and having got between the Enemy and home, he broke down the Bridge over the River, and fell upon them as they returned back with their Booty, which he not only recovered, but cut off above 100 of the Turks, and many of the rest, who endcavoured to swim the River, were drowned. We are told that the Elector of Brandenburgh has promised to add to the Forces which by the late Treaty he is obliged to affift the Emperor with this Campagne, 1200 Men at his own charge. The Dake of Lorrain is ex-1 efted here this week from Inspruck.

Ratubonne, March 26. The States of the Empire affembled here, have granted the Subfidy of so Roman Months, demanded by the Emperor for the War against the Turks: The Colledge of the Imperial Towns, upon whom this Contribution will fall the heaviest, did for some time oppose it, but at last consented, having first obtained, That this Subsidy shall be lookt upon as voluntary; That the States of the Empire may give their Quota's in Men or Money, as they shall judge most convenient; And that the assistance they have already given his Imperial Majesty, shall be taken for part of this Contribution. The 23d instant, the Imperial Commissioners communicated fo the Dyet two Decrees; By one of which, the Emperor approves the Refolution taken by the States of the Empire concerning the Affairs of the Duke of Holstein-Gottorp, which was sent to his Imperial Majesty the 30th of August last; And by the other, exhorts the States to conclude the Preliminary Points, in order to the beginning the Conference for the fetling the Limits between the Empire and the Crown of France, pursuant to the late Treaty

Cologne, April 5. The Magistrates of this City have sent Deputies to Duseldorp, to compliment the Electoral Prince Palatin upon his return thither. The Count de Tecklenbourg passed through this place the 3d Instant, in his way to Bonne, where the Count de Hobenloe is expected in sew days, to confer with his Electoral Highness concerning the matters which are to be treated of at the Conference that's appointed to be held the Bext Month at Augsburgh.

Hague, April 12. The Commissioners of this state for the Busine's of Bantam are returned from England, and the 8th instant they made report of their Negotiation in the Assembly of the States General. The Deputies of Zealand are gone home, except the Pensionary Hubers, who intends to sollow to morrow. They write from Hamburgh, that the differences between the Duke of Zell and that Lity will be composed.

Para, April 17. An Envoy is arrived at this Court from the Elector Palatin, to no fie the death of the Prince is Charlotte of Helfe, Inwages to Charles Louis Elector Palatin, who die at Hydelberg the 26th of the last Month. The report we had here, that the Troops which marched owards Piedmont were Countermanded, is not costirmed.
