"And whereas it has been represented to us, and appears to us to be expedient, that the bounds of such district should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend John, Bishop of Chester, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that the boundaries of the said district of Vauxhall shall hereafter be altered as follows; that is to say: the boundary of the said district on the eastern side thereof shall be extended so as to include within such district all that portion of the said parish of Liverpool situate on the eastern side of the Vauxhall-road, and bounded on the north by an imaginary line along the middle of Naylor-street, on the east by an imaginary line along the middle of Gladstone-street, and on the south by an imaginary line along the middle of the street or road known by the name of Freemason's-row, all of which is delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto annexed, and shall henceforth be united to and form part of the said district of Vauxhall; and that the western limit and

boundary of that portion of the said district which lies south of the Leeds and Liverpool Canal shall be an imaginary line extending towards the north-west from the middle of Tithe Barn-street, along the middle of Lower Milk-street, crossing Cockspur-street obliquely to the middle of Upper Milk-street, and thence along the middle of such street, and continuing in the same direction to the Leeds and Liverpool Canal, and thence westward, along the middle of such canal to the western boundary of the said district, as delineated and set forth in the said map or plan; and that all that portion of the said district south of the Leeds and Liverpool Canal which lies between the above-described limit and the line of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway, and which by such last-mentioned alteration shall hereafter become detached and excluded from the said district, shall, to all intents and purposes, again belong to and form part of the said parish of Liverpool.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the said district, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas due notice of the said scheme has been given in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, and no objections have been made thereto:

“Whereas it was by the said Act enacted, that

so soon as conveniently might be, and by the authority therein provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same) any archdeaconry might, subject to the consent of the bishop, be endowed by the annexation, either of an entire canonry or of a canonry charged with the payment of such portion of its income as should be determined on towards providing for another archdeacon in the same diocese, or with such last-mentioned portion of the income of a canonry, or by augmentation out of the common fund in the same Act mentioned, but not so as in that case to raise the average annual income thereof to an amount exceeding two hundred pounds, and that no canonry should be so charged with the payment of a portion of the income thereof to any archdeacon, unless the average annual income of such canonry, after payment of such portion as aforesaid should amount to or exceed five hundred pounds; with a proviso that no archdeacon should be entitled to hold any endowment, or augmentation, or other emolument as such archdeacon, under the provisions of the same Act, unless resident for the space of eight months in every year within the diocese in which his archdeaconry should be situate, but subject to the same provisions as to licences for non-residence, which are enacted with respect to incumbents of benefices by the Act relating to pluralities. and residence in the same Act mentioned:

“We therefore humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Ashurst Turner, Bishop of Chichester, testified by his having signed and sealed this scheme, that, until the Archdeacon of Chichester shall be elected or appointed to a canonry in the cathedral church of Chichester, there shall be paid by us, out of the common fund in the said Act mentioned, to the Archdeacon of Chichester for the time being (provided that he shall duly reside in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or shall have obtained license of non-residence), the annual sum of one hundred and sixty-three pounds, on the first day of November in every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of November next; and every such payment shall be made only on production to us of a certificate from the bishop that the archdeacon claiming the same has duly resided within the diocese of Chichester, according to the provisions of the said recited Act, or has been legally exempt from such residence:

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the said archdeaconry, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignments be accordingly made and carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith enrolled, pursuant to the said Acts, and registered by the Registrar of the diocese of London.

THE following Regulations are to be observed by the lessees and occupiers, and all persons having the care and controul of the Wallasey Powder Magazines, opposite Liverpool, and are issued under the authority of the Master-General of Her Majesty's Ordnance, pursuant to the provisions of an Act of the 14 and 15 Queen Victoria, chapter 67. Any person failing to observe these Regulations will be guilty of a misdemeanor, and punished accordingly:

1. The premises are to be watched by a warder by day, and a civil watchman during the night. The warder and watchman are not to permit any person but such as are employed in the service to go into the magazines or the enclosures of them. They are not to allow any persons to smoke near the magazines, nor are they to suffer any person to come within the outer gates that has the least appearance of intoxication. In the event of either of those cases occurring, they are immediately to secure the parties offending, and report the circumstance to the storekeeper.
2. All vessels laden with powder lying off the magazines are required to hoist a red flag at the mast head, and the same is not to be removed so long as such vessels remain with powder on board.
3. That 4 poles be erected above high-water mark in that portion of the river in which it is intended to moor powder vessels, to mark off the space within which such vessels are to be placed; 2 of such poles to be fixed to the northward, and 2 to the southward.
4. Whenever barrels or cases containing gunpowder are put into or taken out of carts, such work is required to be superintended by a cooper.
5. When powder is transported by carts, in barrels or cases, it is required that the bottom of the cart shall be covered by a piece of dry white canvas, having a tanned hide underneath, in order to shew whether the barrels or cases are at all defective, which would be easily detected by finding any escape of powder in the transit to or from the vessel. Gutta percha covers must be placed over the barrels or cases.

Such other regulations and precautions practised by the resident inspector and storekeeper to prevent accidents whilst removing and storing gunpowder, and enumerated in the Liscard Code of Regulations, printed and signed "Richard Radcliffe, Town Clerk of Liverpool," are, in all cases applicable to the magazines at Wallasey, to be strictly followed.
