" 25. That the patronage of the rectories of Great and Little Birch, in the county of Essex and diocese of Rochester, alternately with C. Round, Esquire, his heirs and assigns, and the patronage of the vicarage of Northweald Bassett alternately with — Plumer, Esquire, his heirs and assigns, and the patronage of the perpetual curacy of Halstead Trinity alternately with the Crown, and which said alternate patronage is now vested in the Bishop of London, be transferred

unto and thenceforth be and remain vested in the Bishop of Rochester and his successors.

" 26. That the patronage of the several benefices comprised in the Table XII, hereinafter set forth, and which said patronage is now vested in the bishops whose names are set opposite to the names of the said benefices in the said Table XII, be transferred unto and thenceforth be and remain vested in the Bishop of Salisbury and his successors.

" And we further recommend and propose, that the right of patronage or alternate patronage respectively, as the case may be, of all the benefices and churches hereinbefore mentioned, shall be transferred and exchanged in the manner hereinbefore recommended and proposed, without any transfer, conveyance, or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same.

" And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters herein contained, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the several dioceses of Canterbury, London, Winchester, Bath and Wells, Chichester, Ely, Gloucester and Bristol, Hereford, Lichfield, Lincoln, Norwich, Oxford, Peterborough, Rochester, Salisbury, and Worcester.
