AT the Court at *Buckingham-Palace*, the 30th day of *June 1852*,

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to consolidate and amend the law relating to the "Militia in England," it is amongst other things enacted, that "it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to raise, and, from time to time, to keep up, any number not exceeding eighty thousand private militia men, to serve for the several counties, ridings, and places required by the therein first recited Act to raise militia, fifty thousand of whom may be raised in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, and thirty thousand in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three:"

And it is thereby provided "that if it shall happen that the number of men to be raised in either of such years shall not be fully raised in the year in which the same is appointed to be raised, the number deficient may be raised as soon as may be thereafter:"

And it is thereby further enacted, that "it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, forthwith, after the passing of the said Act, and afterwards, from time to time, as occasion may appear to Her Majesty to require, to ascertain and fix the number of militia men who shall, until other quotas shall be fixed, in like manner, serve for each county, riding, and place, and the numbers so fixed as aforesaid shall be transmitted to the respective lieutenants of the said counties, ridings, and places from time to time, and notice of the same shall be published in the London Gazette, and the numbers so from time to time appointed by Her Majesty shall be the quotas of the several counties, ridings, and places until other quotas are appointed in like manner."

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to ascertain and fix the number of militia men who shall, until other quotas shall be fixed in like manner, serve for each county, riding, and place, according to the several numbers specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed, and amounting in the whole to eighty thousand men, and which said Schedule Her Majesty is pleased to direct shall be taken as part of

this Order, and that this Order, with the Schedule thereunto annexed, be published in the London Gazette, and be transmitted to the respective lieutenants of the said counties, ridings, and places, in order that they should proceed upon the same in pursuance of the directions of the said Act of Parliament.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous parishes;" and of the first section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to further amend the Church Building Acts;" or under and by virtue of any and every other power or authority contained in the Church Building Acts, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of June one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, in the words following; viz.:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Saint John,

Westminster, in the county of Middlesex, and in the diocese of London, it appears to them to be expedient that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church of the Holy Trinity, situate in Bessborough Gardens, in the said parish of Saint John, Westminster, under and by virtue of the power or authority for this purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous parishes;' and in the first section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to further amend the Church Building Acts;' or under and by virtue of every other power or authority in this behalf contained in the Church Building Acts, and that such proposed district should comprise a portion of the said parish of Saint John, Westminster, and also a portion of the district chapelry of Saint Mary, Tothill Fields (heretofore assigned out of the said parish of Saint John, Westminster), and should be called 'The District Chapelry of the Holy Trinity, Vauxhall Bridge Road,' and that the boundaries thereof should be those hereinafter mentioned; that is to say:

"The boundary commences at the point where the Great Sewer discharges itself into the Thames, and proceeds in a north-westerly direction above the middle of the said sewer until it reaches a point where Bessborough-street and Lupus-street unite opposite to Tachbrook-street; then proceeds up the middle of Tachbrook-street as far as Morton-street; then proceeds in a north-easterly direction along the middle of Morton-street to the Vauxhall-bridge-road; then in a south-easterly direction along the middle of the said Vauxhall-bridge-road to a point directly opposite to Five Chimney-court; then along the middle of the said Five Chimney-court into Douglas-street, and along the middle of that street, and easterly into Regent-street; then in a northerly direction along the middle of Regent-street to a point where Causton-street enters Regent-street; then down the middle of Causton-street in an easterly direction in a straight line to the wall of the Millbank Prison; then follows the line of the said wall in a south-easterly direction to the Great Gate of the said Prison; from thence in a stright line to the Water Gate of the said Prison; then turns south-westerly and proceeds along the bank of the river Thames to the point where the Great Sewer discharges itself as aforesaid, which said district chapelry of the Holy Trinity, Vauxhall-bridge-road is more particularly delineated in the map or plan hereunto annexed, and is thereon coloured red.

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent that it also appears to them to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, and churchings should be solemnized or performed in the said church of the Holy Trinity, and that the fees to arise therefrom (except those from marriages), should forthwith be paid and belong to the incumbent of such church for the time being. That the fees from marriages should also belong to such incumbent from and after the next avoidance of the parish church of the said parish of Saint John, Westminster.

"That the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Charles James, Bishop of the said diocese of London, has been obtained thereto, as required by the Acts and sections firstly and

secondly hereinbefore mentioned, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this representation.

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns, and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, and churchings, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of London.

Hartlepool.—Legal Quays.

WE, the undersigned, Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, do hereby, under the authority of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the ninth and tenth years of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to amend the laws relating to the Customs," appoint the several places hereinafter mentioned, within the port of Hartlepool, to be legal quays for the lading and unloading of goods, and we do hereby declare the limits of such quays to be as follows; that is to say: all those open places, called the Quay and Jetty, situate on the north-west side of the West Harbour of Hartlepool, the said Quay extending in length from the south-west end thereof to the entrance of the first dock one thousand six hundred and forty feet, and varying in breadth from sixty feet to one hundred and fifty-two feet; and the said Jetty being in length from the said Quay to its termination in the said harbour nine hundred and thirty feet, and varying in breadth from ten feet to eighty feet.

Also, all that open place or quay situate on the south-west and north-west sides of the said first dock at Hartlepool aforesaid, extending in length from the south-east corner of the said first dock to the south-west extremity of the entrance of the second dock nine hundred and seventy-five feet, and varying in breadth from sixty feet to two hundred feet.

Also, all that open place or quay situate on the south-west and north-west sides of the said second dock at Hartlepool aforesaid, extending in length from the south-east corner of the said second dock to the south side of the entrance to the graving dock one thousand two hundred and seventy-two feet, and of the continuous breadth of sixty feet.

Also, all that other open place or quay situate at the north-west and north-east sides of the said second dock at Hartlepool aforesaid, extending in length from the north side of the entrance to the said graving dock in an easterly direction to West Harbour two thousand three hundred and ten feet, and varying in breadth from twenty feet to sixty feet.

And also, all that other open place or quay situate on the north-east side of the said first dock at Hartlepool aforesaid, extending in length from the east side of the entrance to said first dock to the western extremity of the entrance to the said second dock nine hundred and ten feet, and varying in breadth from thirty-six feet to one hundred and forty feet.
