

## CONTRACTS FOR RAISINS AND PEAS.

Department of the Comptroller for  
Victualling and Transport Services,  
Somerset-Place, July 5, 1852.

**T**HE Commissioners for executing the office of  
Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom  
of Great Britain and Ireland do hereby give notice,  
that, on Thursday the 29th instant, at one o'clock,  
they will be ready to treat with such persons as  
may be willing to contract for supplying and  
delivering into Her Majesty's Victualling Stores  
at Gosport and Plymouth, the undermentioned  
articles; viz.:

Raisins (Eleme Valentia, or any other descrip-  
tion), 15 tons, Gosport; 8 tons, Plymouth;  
half to be delivered at each place in one  
month, and the remainder in a month after-  
wards, or earlier if preferred by the party  
tendering.

Peas, 175 quarters, Gosport; 75 quarters,  
Plymouth; half to be delivered at each place  
in one month, and the remainder in a month  
afterwards, or earlier if preferred by the party  
tendering.

The raisins to be exempted from the Customs' duties.

Samples of the raisins (not less than 3 lbs.), of  
the peas (not less than 4 quarts), must be pro-  
duced by the parties tendering, otherwise the tenders  
will not be noticed.

The conditions of the revised contracts, to which  
particular attention is called, may be seen at the  
said Office, at the Victualling Yards at Gosport  
and Plymouth, at the Office of Commander Bevis,  
at Liverpool, and of the Collector of Customs at  
Bristol.

No tender will be received after one o'clock on  
the day of treaty, nor any noticed, unless the party  
attends, or an agent for him duly authorized in  
writing.

Every tender must be addressed to the Secretary  
of the Admiralty, and bear in the left-hand corner  
the words "Tender for \_\_\_\_\_" and must also  
be delivered at Somerset-place, and those for raisins  
must be accompanied by a letter, signed by a  
responsible person, engaging to become bound with  
the person tendering in the sum of £20 per cent. on  
the value, for the due performance of the contract.
