The Opinions upon the debate of this matter were various, and we know not what Refolution was taken, but it's hoped that by the endeavors of the Minillers who employ their Offices therein, these Affairs will be at last amicably composed. The Auxiliary Forces of Brandenburgh are on their march through Silefis. They write from Sueden, that 20 Men of War are fitting out in that Kingdom.

Hague, May 10. The States of Holland are again affembled. We are told that the Electoral Prince of Brandenburgh intends to come hither the next Month with the Princess his wife, to see this Countrey. The Ships designed for the Streights under the Command of the Count de Stirum, will fail in few days.

Our Governor General re-Brussels, May 10. turned hither on Wednesday last from Flanders. The Letters from Madrid of the 25th of the last Month tell us, That the Marquis de los Balbaces bad, by Order of the King of Spain, declared to the French Amballador, that his Catholick Majefty would give the King his Mafter fatisfaction concerning the Money raifed in the West-Indies, but that the Amballador had defired to fee fome effects .of this Declaration, before he gave his most Chriflian Maj.fly an account of it. The laft Letters from Vienna are of the 28th paft, they inform us, flian Maj.fly an account of it. that Lieutenant-General Scherffenberg was marched into Transilvania with 9000 Germans, and 4000 Hungarians, and that to form this Body, some Regiments had been drawn from the Siege of Mon**gaz**; That his defign was kept very fecret, but the common Report was, that Prince Abafti having promifed to join his Forces with those of the Emperor, he was fent to demand the performance of it, and if he fa led in it, to burn and deftroy that Countrey.

Paris, May 11. The difference with the Crown of Spain concerning the 500000 Crowns railed upon the French Effects in the West-Indies, is not yet accommolated; And we are cold, that the French Amballador at Madrid has given in a new Memorial about this matter. The King has given the Marquis de Boufflers the General Command of his Forces in Guyerne. We have an account of his Forces in Guyenne. from Turin, that the Duke of Savoy having marched in Person against his Subjects of the Valley of Luserne, who being 12000 flrong, had fortified the Patrages of the Mountains, his Highneffes Troops, with thole of this Crown commanded by the Sieur Catinat Licutenant-General, began to attack them the 21 pass, and having in three or four days forced their feveral Pofts, which they defended very Guinea Reward.
