and every such claimant who shall so prove his title, after making all just allowances (including an allowance for the subscriptions paid by such claimant). And I further give notice, that any of the contributories or alleged contributories of the said Company will be at liberty to attend such sittings respectively, and that any person or persons claiming any such right or title as aforesaid, must come in before me at the time and place aforesaid, and establish such claim, or they will be excluded the benefit of the said Act to dissolve the National Land Company.—Dated this twenty-eighth day of August 1852.
