Milan; April 24:

UR new Governor, the Count de Fuen/alida, arrived here the 22d Inftant from Pavia, accompanied with a great many Perfons of Quality; The next day the Cardinal Visconti, Archbishop of Milan, made his Excellency a Vist, to compliment him upon his coming to this Go.

to compliment him upon his coming to this Government; And all the Great Officers and Minifters of State were likewife to make their Compliments to his Excellency.

Venice, April 27. The daft Letters from the Morea give an account, That after the raifing the Siege of Chielifa and the taking the Enemies Cannon and Baggage, Captain-General Morofini cau-fed his Troops to Re-embark at Porto Vitulo, and failed with the Fleet towards the Gulph of Calamasa; That a Body of Turkish Horse was encamped near Niezi, a place which the Captain Baffa much delights in, who hearing of the approach of the Venetion Fleet, decamped, and retired in great diforeler, leaving behind them feveral Mules and Wagons with a great deal of Provision, which they were in too much hafte to take with them; And that the Maynores purfued the Enemy, and killed and took Prifoners a confiderable number of them. We have Advice that the Balla of Candia having lately taken a Re-view of the Ottoman Troops in that Kingdom, found they were not 12000, and thele, for the most part, raw, undifciplined Men; And that they are in great fear the Venetians will make a Defcent in that Ifland. By a Veffel come from Smirna, we are informed that Nine Men of War of Barbary were-arrived there under the Command of Babaffar, but

that they were very ill Manned. Genoua, April 27. We have Advice that the Squadron of Men of War commanded.<sup>1</sup> the Duke of Mortemar, failed from Toulon the 9th Inflant to the Weftward. Two days ago parted from hence one of this States Gallies for Civita Vedchia, to join with the Pope's Gallies that are defigned againft the Turks. It's faid that the Chriftians will have this Summer in the Levant 55 Gallies, 4 Galeaffes, and 30 Men of War; A Force much fuperior to what the Turks will be able to bring to Scat. It is confirmed that the Algierines have broke with the Dutch.

Dutch. Madrid, April 25. The 22d Inftant their Cathoick Majeities went from hence to the Buen-Retito, intending to pass fome fort time there, and to go afterwards to Aranjuez. Prince Eugene of Savoy, who covered before the King the 16th Inftant, as Grandee of Spain of the firft Rahk, parted from hence the 18th for Humeary. They write from Cadiz, that 12 Men of War of the Fleet that's to go and meet the Galeons were ready to put to Sea, that the reft were equipping with great difigence and that they expected three Ships from Holland, where they have been lately built for the Service of this Crown, and fix from Bilcaye, to join the faid Fleet:

Lemburgh, April 12. The King of Poland arri3 ved here the 6th Instant; and the next day received by an Express from his Ambassadors at Moscour, a Project of the Conditions upon which the Czart are wiling to enter into an Offenfive and Defenfive League against the Turks, the chief of which is ; That this Crown shall quit all manner of Pretensions to the Cities of Kievia and Smolensko; The King having thereupon confulted with the Senators that are here, it was refolved to comply therein ; and that the faid Project flould be fent back to the Ambaffadors, with directions to haften the conclu-fion of this Alliance; By which the Mofcovites will be obliged to employ a great Army against the Tartars, thereby to divert them from joining with the Turks against this Crown. The King has, fince his being here, held feveral Councils of War. We We. do not hear that the day is yet fixed for the general Rendezvous, but it's believed 'twill be about the beginning of June. We have an account from Tur-ky, that the Refident of this Crown at the Pore; who has been a Prisoner there ever fince the beginning of this War, has at laft obtained his Liberty; and is returning home with new Overtures of Peace from the Grand Vilier.

Vienna, April 28. The News of Lieutenant-Ge-neral Scherffenberg's being entred into Transilvania with a Body of 1 ocoo Men, is confirmed, but what his Orders are, is not yet known; It was reported upon the first Advice we had of the march of. thele Forces, that they were to join with those of Transilvania, but by the account we have fince ; that the Treaty between General Caraffa and the Deputies of Transilvania about fetling the Contributions, is broken off) and that the Imperialits have thereupon made feveral Incurfions into that Country, there feems to be more reafon to believe that they are gone to treat Prince Abasti as an Enemy, than to join with him as a Friend.
