Naples, April 2.

**T**HE Marquis de Liche, Vicesoy of this Kingdom, has received Orders from Madrid, to put in execution the Project for the Coining of New Money. His Excellency has stopt the payment of the Pensions and Salaries of several Officers, upon the advice he has received of the great Reform that has been resolved on in the Council of Spain. The Baron of Villermis is arrived here, to take possession of his Command of Lieutenant-General of the Horse in this Kingdom.

Leghorne, April 25. The Gallies, which the Great Duke sends to the assistance of the Republick of Venice, will sail from hence the next week. A Vessel is arrived here in six weeks from Alexandria, the Master reports, that he left in that Port Nine Merchant Ships ready to sail, being bound for Constantinople with Provisions and Ammunition; and 2000 Men, which the Bassa of Cairo had raised with a great deal of difficulty, and whereof the greatest part were young Men who had never been in any Service.

Venice, April 27. We have advice of General Coningmark's Arrival at Corfu with the Troops that went with him from hence; And that he intended to part again from thence so soon as he had heard from the Captain-General, who was expected with the Fleet at Zant. The Letters from the Morea say, the *Mavrotes* have possessed themselves of all the Posts about *Madon*, so that that Garrison is in a manner blocked up; It's believed the Captain-General will begin the Campaigne with the Siege of this place. Count *Bernabo Visconti* who commands one of the Regiments of the *Mulanzes*, now in the Service of this Republick, is still here with between 2 and 300 Men of those Troops, and does not intend to part from hence for the *Levant*, till the 10th of the next Month. The Letters from *Roma* tell us, that the Duke of *Hanover*, accompanied with the Prince his Son, arrived there the 19th of this Month with a great and splendid Train.

Genova, April 30. The Spanish Envoy had the 27th instant Audience of the Doge, to thank him on the behalf of the Count de *Fuenfajada*, the new Governor of *Milan*, for the good Reception and Entertainment he had here; And to acquaint him, that in pursuance of the Orders he had from the Court of Spain, he had caused the Goods be-

longing to the Subjects of this State, which were seized by Order of the Count de *Melgar*, to be restored. The Gallies of the Squadron of the Duke of *Turris* which lately arrived here, sailed from hence the 25th having Orders to return to *Naples*.

Marzeilles, May 10. This week arrived here a Merchant Ship from the Westward, which met off of *Madorca*, the French Fleet, that sailed lately from *Toulon*, under the Command of the Duke de *Acottemar*. By a Bark which arrived here yesterday in eight days from *Argiers*, we have advice, that the *Algerines* had brought in four small Dutch Prizes; That they had 20 Men of War at Sea, and six or seven more ready to sail; And that they had visited one or two French Vessels for Dutch Goods.

Warsaw, April 19. The King of Poland is still at *Lemburg*, where he has held several Councils of War. The Troops have Orders to begin their march to the place appointed for the General Rendezvous, which, however, it's believed will not be till the 10th of June, by reason the Troops of *Lithuania* cannot be there till the latter end of the next Month, and that the Army will not be able to take the Field sooner for want of Forage. It is reported that there has been a new Encounter between the *Poles* and the *Tartars*, and that 1200 of the latter were killed upon the place, with several of their chief Officers. The Count *Wislopolski*, Great Chancellor of this Kingdom, returned thither the 16th Instant from his Embassy in France, and parted again from hence yesterday for *Jawaron*, where he intends to stay till the King returns from *Lemburg*. We are told that the *Moscovites* refuse to make War upon the *Turks*, but offer upon condition this Crown will yield to them *Kozia* and *Smolensko*, to employ their Forces against the *Tartars*.

Vienna, May 2. The Duke of *Lorraine* will part from hence the beginning of the next week for *Hungary*, with a great many Persons of Quality of several Nations who are come hither to serve in the War as Volunteers; In the mean time the Imperial Troops are marching to the General Rendezvous, and all things will be ready by the 25th of this Month for the opening of the Campaigne; It was said that the first Enterprizes would be against *Agria* and *Alba Regalis*, but we are now assured, that the Resolution is taken to besiege *Buda*, while another Army encamps between that place and *Alba Regalis*, to cover the Siege; And to hinder the *Turks* from receiving any Relief by the *Daribe* a small Body will at the same time be posted in the Isle of *St. Marguerite*; which lies above *Buda*.

Lieutenant-General *Scherffenberg* having caused his Troops to Rendezvous near *Ungwar*, is entred into *Transilvania*, to oblige the States of that Country to perform the Agreement that hath been made with their Deputies, about their providing for the subsistence of the Imperial Troops quartered on that side, and to observe Prince *Abafsi*, who seems, after all the professions his Deputies have made at this Court, to have more inclination to join with the *Turks* than with the *Imperialists*. The last Letters from *Croatia*, confirm the News we had by our former, of the defeat of 3000 *Turks* who were marching under the command of *Bassa Fundrucke*, with a design to surprize *Virovitza*; In this occasion the *Imperialists* took 36 Colours, and four Kettle Drums, with all the Enemies Baggage. The last week happened an ill Accident in the Arsenal here, which was, that some Powder taking Fire as they were filling of Bombs, several Persons were hurt, among which was *Don Gonzales*, the Spanish Ingenier, but it was a great providence that the other Powder (of which there was a great quantity) and the Bombs that lay filled in the same Room, did not likewise take fire. The Duke of *Zell* has recalled his Envoy at this Court, who had the late Rencontre with the Deputies of *Hamburg*.

*Francfort*, May 7. They write from *Vienna*, that the States of *Transilvania* having refused to ratifie the Treaty lately concluded by their Deputies at *Vienna*, the Count de *Scherffenberg* is entred into that Country at the Head of 10000 Men, to oblige them to perform what has been stipulated by their said Deputies. The General Rendezvous of the Imperial Army is appointed to be on the 25th of the next Month near *Barkan*. The Elector of *Bavaria* is expected the 12th of this Month at *Newstadt*, where the Imperial Court now is.

*Cologne*, May 10. The Letters from *Ratisbonne*, of the 6th Instant, tell us, That the Count de *Windtsgraez*, the Emperor's Commissioner at the Dyet, had acquainted the Deputies of the Princes residing there, That his Imperial Majesty had appointed a Conference to be held the beginning of the next Month at *Ausburgh*, to which he had particularly invited the Circles of *Bavaria*, *Franconia*, *Suabia*, and the *Upper Rhine*; And that the intention of this Meeting is to take such Resolutions as shall be thought most conducing to the security and preservation of the Empire. We are told from *Metz*, that the *French* are preparing for the Camp they intend to have this Summer on the *Saar*. The Relations of the Burghermasters *Cronenberg* and *Cremps*, who were, during the late disorders here, put out of the Magistracy, and died not long after in Prison, having begun a Process against the Magistrates of this City for these unjust Proceedings against them, they have obtained a Sentence by which Reparation is ordered to be made as well in Honour, as Estate, to the Heirs of the Persons deceased.

*Brague*, May 14. The Heer *Van Heemskerke*, Ambassador from this State at *Madrid*, having obtained leave to return home, the States have named the Heer *Batie* to reside at that Court in the Quality of their Envoy Extraordinary, who will very suddenly begin his Journey thither. The Sieur *Raule*, Intendant of the Marine to the Elector of *Brandenburg*, is come hither, and has had a Conference with the Deputies of the *States General*, about the differences that remain between the Subjects of his Electoral Highness, and those of this State, concerning their Trade in the *West-Indies*. The Count

of *Nassau Sarbrucke* is arrived here from *Germany*.

*Amwerp*, May 15. The Letters from *Vienna* of the 5th Instant say, they had received advice, that Lieutenant-General de *Mercy* had defeated Count *Teckelej*, who was marching with a Body of *Turks* commanded by a *Bassa*, to attempt the Relief of *Mongatz*; That 1000 of the *Turks* were slain, and that *Teckelej* and the *Bassa* escaped very narrowly, being forced to swim a River to save themselves; of which we expect a more particular Account by our next.

*Paris*, May 17. The 11th Instant the Deputies of the States of *Britany* had Audience of the King at *Versailles*, being conducted by the Sieur de *Sasnot*, Master of the Ceremonies, and presented to his Majesty by the Duke de *Chaunes*, Governor of that Province. Monsieur de *Louvois* has been ill with a Fever, but is at present pretty well again. The News here is, that the *French Fleet* is before *Cadix*.

*Whitehall*, May 10. This day the Parliament met at *Westminster*, and was again Prorogued till the 22d of *November* next.
