Naples , April 2.

HE Marquis de Liche, Viceroy of this Kingdom, has received Orders from Madrid, to put in execution the Project for the Coining of New Money. His Excellency has ftopt the payment of the Penfions and Salaries of several Officers, upon the advice he has received of the great Reform that has been resolved on in the Council of The Baron of Villermin is arrived here, to take possersion of his Command of Lieutenant-General of the Horse in this Kingdom.

Leghorne, April 25. The Gallies, which the Great Duke fends to the affiltance of the Republick of Venice, will fail from hence the next week. A Vessel is arrived here in fix weeks from Alexandria, the Master reports, that he left in that Port Nine Merchant Ships ready to Gil, being bound for Constantinopie with Provisions and Ammunition; and 2000 Men, which the Bassa of Carro had raised with a great deal of difficulty, and whereof the greatest part were young Men who had never been

in any Service.

Vanior, April 27. We have advice of General Coning finark's Arrival at Corfou with the Troops that went with him from hence; And that he, intended-to part again from thence so soon as he had heard from the Captain-General, who was expected with the fleet at Zane. The Letters from the Morea fay, the Mayuves have possessed themselves of all the Posts about M don, so that that Garison is in a manner blocked up; It's believed the Captain-General will begin the Campagne with the Siege of this place. Count Bernabo Visconti who com-mands one of the Regiments of the Milaneze, now in the Service of this Republick, is still here with between 2 and 300 Men of those Troops, and does not intend to part from hence for the Levant, till The Letters from the 10th of the next Month. Roma tell us, that the Duke of Hanouer; accompanied with the Prince his Son, arrived there the 19th of this Month with a great and splendid
