Lieutenant-General Scherffenberg having caufed his Troops to Rendezvous near Ungwar, is entred into Transilvania, to oblige the States of that Countrey to perform the Agreement that hath been made with their Deputies, about their providing for the sublistence of the Imperial Troops quartered on that fide, and to obferve Prince Abafti, who feens, after all the professions his Deputies have made at this Court, to have more inclination to join with the Turks than with the Impersalifts. The last Letters from Croatia, confirm the News we had by our former, of the defeat of 3000 Turks who were marching under the command of Balla Fundrucke, with a defign to surprize Virovitza; In this occafion the Imperialists took 36 Coloms, and four Kettle Drums, with all the Enemies Baggage. The laft week happened an ill Accident in the Arfenal here, which was, that fome Powder taking Fire as they were filling of Bombs, feveral Persons were hurt, 'among which was Don Gonzales, the Spanifs Ingenier, but it was a great providence that the other Powder (of which there was a great quantity) and the Bombs that lay filled in the fame Room, did not likewife take fire. The Duke of Zell has

recalled his Envoy at this Court, who had the late Rencounter with the Deputies of Hamburgh. Francfort, May 7. They wilte from Vienna, that the States of Transiloania having refused to ratifie the Treaty lately concluded by their Deputies at Vienna, the Count de Scherffenberg is entred into that Countrey at the Head of roooo Men, to oblige them to perform what has been ftipulated by their faid Deputies. The General Rendezvous of the Imperial Army is appointed to be on the 25th of the next Month near Barkan. The Elector of Bavaria is expected the izrh of this Month at Neuffade, where the Imperial Court now is. Cologne, May 19. The Letters from Ratif-

Cologne, May 19. The Letters from Ratif-bonne, of the 6th Inftant, tell us, That the Count de Winditfgratz, the Emperor's Commissioner at the Dyet, had acquainted the Deputies of the Princes refiding there, That his Imperial Majefty had appointed a Conference to be held the beginning of the next Month at Ausburgh, to which he had particularly invited the Circles of Bavaria, Franconia, Suabia, and the Upper Rhine; And that the inten-tion of this Meeting is to take fuch Refolutions as fhall be thought most conducing to the fecurity and prefervation of the Empire. We are told from Merz, that the French are preparing for the Camp they intend to have this Summer on the Saar. The Relations of the Burghermasters Cronenberg and Cremps, who were, during the late diforders here, put out of the Magistracy, and died not long after in Prison, having begun a Process against the Magistrates of this City for these unjust Proceedings against them, they have obtained a Sentence by which Reparation is ordered to be made as well in Honour, as Effate, to the Heirs of the Perfons deceafed.

Hague, May 14. The Heer Van Heeniskerke, Ambalfador from this State at Madrid, having obtained leave to return home, the States have named the Heer Batie to relide at that Court in the Quality of their Envoy Extraordinary, who will very fud-denly begin his Journey thither. The Sieur Raule, Intendant of the Marine to the Elector of Brandenburgh, is come hither, and has had a Conference. with the Deputics of the States General, about the differences that remain between the Subjects of his Electoral Highness, and those of this State, concerning their Trade in the West-Indies. The Count

of Nallau Sarbrucke is arrived here from Germany.

Antwerp, May 15. The Letters from Dienna of the 5th Inflant fay, they-had received advice, that Lieutenant-General de Mercy had defeated Count Teckeley, who was marching with a Body of Turks commanded by a Bassa, to attempt the Re-lief of Mongatz; That 1000 of the Turks were slain, and that Teckeley and the Bassa escaped very narrowly, being forced to fwim a River to fave themfelves; of which we expect a more particular Account by our next.

The 11th Inftant the Deputies Paris, May 17. of the States of Britany had Audience of the King at Verfailles, being conducted by the Sieur de Saintot , Master of the Ceremonies, and presented to his Majefty by the Duke de Chaunes, Governor of that Province. Monfieur de Louvois has been ill with a Fever, but is at prefent pretty well again. The News here is, that the French Fleet is before Cadiz.

Whitehall, May 10. This day the Parliament met at Westminster, and was again Prorogued till the 22d of November next,
