N pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of the reign of Her Majesty, chapter seventy-three, entitled " An Act to make provision for a permanent Establishment of Officers to perform the duties at Nisi Prius, in the Superior Courts of Common Law, and for the payment of such Officers, and of the Judges Clerks by Salaries, and to abolish certain Offices in those Courts."
