The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the ninth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the "further amendment of the Church Building Acts," and of the first section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eleventh and and twelfth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the law relative to the assign-"ment of ecclesiastical districts," and of the nineteenth section of an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the Church Building Acts," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twentysecond day of December, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, in the words following,

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Wolstanton, of the chapelry district of Saint James New Chapel, of the particular district of Golden Hill, and of the parish of Audley, all in the county of Stafford, and in the diocese of Lichfield, (such particular district of Golden Hill having been duly assigned under the power or authority for that purpose contained in the tenth section of an Act passed in the session of Parliament, holden in the first and second years of the reign of his late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled 'An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act 'passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled an Act to amend the Acts for building and promoting the building of additional Churches in populous parishes;") it appears to them to be expedient to unite and consolidate certain contiguous portions of the said parish of Wolstanton, the chapelry district of Saint James New Chapel, the particular district of Golden Hill, and the said parish of Audley, and to form the same into one consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, for the consecrated Church of Saint Thomas, situate at Kidsgrove, in the said particular district of Golden Hill, under | aforesaid; and turn in a westerly direction along

and by virtue of the power or authority contained in the ninth section of an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for 'the further amendment of the Church Building 'Acts,' and in the first section of an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eleventh and twelfth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled An Act to amend the law relative to the assign-ment of ecclesiastical districts, and in the nineteenth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the fourteenth and fifteenth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to amend the Church Building Acts,' and that such proposed consolidated chapelry should be named or called 'The Consolidated Chapelry of 'Kidsgrove,' and that the boundaries thereof should be those hereinafter mentioned; that is to say: The boundaries commence at the southwestern end of the township of Brieryhurst, at the point marked A on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and proceed in a north-easterly and northerly direction, by the trace of an old brook course which divides the parishes of Church Lawton and Wolstanton, to the point marked B as aforesaid; then turn south-easterly, and proceed along the road leading from Hall Green to New Chapel, to the point marked C as aforesaid; and from thence, in a south-westerly direction, along the road leading from New Chapel to Kidsgrove, to the point marked D as aforesaid; and from thence, in a south-easterly direction, along a fence dividing lands, respectively belonging to Thomas Kinnersly, Esquire, and Charles Bourne Lawton, Esquire, to the point marked E as aforesaid; and thence take the boundary line between the town-ships of Brieryhurst and Oldcote, in a southwesterly direction, as far as the point marked F as aforesaid; thence south-easterly, following the boundary between the townships of Oldcote and Ranscliffe, along the western side of the Old-road leading from Kidsgrove to Tunstall, to the point marked G as aforesaid; thence south-westerly, along a fence dividing the said townships of Oldcote and Ranscliffe, to the point marked H as aforesaid; and from thence turn in a westerly direction along a brook course, to the point marked I as aforesaid; and from thence along the highway leading from Kidsgrove to Ranscliffe, in a southerly direction, to the point marked K as aforesaid; and continues along the same road through Ranscliffe, to the road leading to Tunstall from Talk o'the Hill, to the point marked L as

the last-mentioned road, to its junction with the turnpike-road leading from Congleton to Newcastle-under-Lyne, to the point marked M as aforesaid; from thence, in a northerly direction, along the said turnpike road to the point marked N as aforesaid, where it meets a footpath; and from thence, in a north-easterly direction, along such footpath, to the point marked O as aforesaid; thence north-westerly along a highway as far as a fence dividing two fields called The Lunts, be-longing to Thomas Kinnersly, Esquire, to the point where it meets a tramway; and from thence in a north-easterly direction, along such tramway to the point where it meets the highway, leading from the turnpike road, from Newcastle to Congleton to the Old Red Bull, at Lawton, and proceeds along such highway as far as a fence dividing the parishes of Lawton and Audley, and proceed along such fence, in a north-easterly and northerly direction, as far as the said point marked A as aforesaid, where the boundaries of the said consolidated chapelry of Kidsgrove commenced, and as the same is more particularly delineated on the said map or plan hereunto annexed, and is thereon

coloured green, yellow, blue and pink.

"That the consents of the Right Reverend John, Bishop of the said diocese of Lichfield, and also patron, in right of his see, of the church of the said particular district of Golden Hill; of Ralph Sneyd, of Keel Hall, in the said county of Stafford, Esquire, (patron of the parish church of the said parish of Wolstanton); of Charles Bourne Lawton, of Lawton Hall, in the county of Chester, Esquire; the said Ralph Sneyd and of Charles Heaton, of Endon, in the said county of Stafford, Gentlemen, (patrons of the church of the said district chapelry of Saint James new chapel); and of the Reverend Edward Gilbert, of Hardingstone, in the county of Northampton, Clerk, (patron of the parish church of the said parish of Audley), have been severally obtained to the formation of the said consolidated chapelry of Kidsgrove, as required by the Acts and sections hereinbefore mentioned, in testimony whereof they have severally signed and sealed this representation.

"Your Majesty's said commissioners beg leave further to represent that it has been mutually agreed between the said John, Bishop of Lichfield, Ralph Sneyd, Charles Bourne Lawton, Ralph Sneyd, Charles Heaton and Edward Gilbert (as such respective patrons as aforesaid), testified as aforesaid (with the approbation of your Majesty's said Commissioners, testified as hereinafter mentioned, and also of the said John, Bishop of Lichfield, testified as aforesaid), that right of presentation and appointment of an incumbent or perpetual curate, to serve the said church of Saint Thomas at Kidsgrove aforesaid, should be vested in, belong to, and, whenever occasion may require, be exercised by, Thomas Kinnersly, of Clough Hall, in the said county of Stafford, Esquire, his heirs and assigns for ever.

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners therefore humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto, as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed formation into one consolidated chapelry, be accordingly made, and the agreement in respect of the presentation and appointment of an incumbent or perpetual curate to serve the said church of Saint Thomas, at Kidsgrove, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith registered, by the Registrar of the diocese of Lichfield.
