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Constantinople, February 22.

YOU have already had an account of the Changes that have been occasioned at this Court, by the ill Successes of the last Campaign, of which we can now give a more particular Relation. After the defeat of the Turkish Army near Gran, there arose great Divisions among the Janitories and Spahis, each laying the blame thereof upon the other; The Seraskier Shaitan Ibrahim thinking by severity to put a stop to this growing mischief, cut off the heads of the chief Promoters thereof; but the disorder still increased, and many Officers as well as Soldiers deserted; Upon which an Officer was sent from Adrianople with a Sum of Money to be distributed among the Soldiers, and with Orders to inquire into the cause of these Disturbances; And a report was made very much to the prejudice of Shaitan Ibrahim. About the same time there was a Mutiny of the Spahis at Adrianople, which was quickly appeased, by cutting off the Heads of four of the chief Ringleaders. The 17th of November, the Copelarkian (or Master of the Ceremonies to the Grand Signior) was sent to Hungary with a Command to take off the Head of Shaitan Ibrahim, and to declare Abdi Bassa of Buda Seraskier in his place, and Osman Oglu Visier of Buda, but Osman's Head was cut off by Ibrahim three days before the Copelarkian arrived at Belgrade. The Son of Shaitan Ibrahim's Head was brought to Adrianople; He was about 30 years old, had served 40 years in the greatest Employments, and had performed very signal Services, particularly in the defence of Buda in the year 1684; but neither his Services, nor his having had for Wife the Grand Signior's Aunt, and after her decease, his Sister, availed him, the blame of an unsuccessful Campaign being turned upon him, and he being farther charged with having converted the Soldiers Pay and Provisions to his own profit. The last Autumn the Grand Visier Cara Ibrahim was for three months confined by an Indisposition to his Chamber, never coming all that time to the Divan; The Ottoman Arms were unsuccessful in all Parts but in Roland, where Solymán Bassa defended the Confines with applause; The Grand Visier perceiving his Interest begun to be very considerable, and fearing he would be called to Court, thought it his best way to be the Author of it himself, and accordingly prayed the Grand Signior, that seeing his Sickness disabled him to take upon him the care of the Publick Affairs, he might have the assistance of Solymán Bassa, which was granted. Solymán arrived at Adrianople the 25th of November, and was received by the Visier with all the appearance of Esteem and a real Friendship. The Grand Signior sent him a rich Sable Vest, and two Horces richly furnished, according to which Example, the Visier and all the great Men made Presents to him; The next day he sat in the Divan, and dispatched all Publick Business. But the Visier being pretty well recovered, saw the ground Solymán got, which made him resolve to remove him again from Court. He therefore represented to the Grand Signior, that Solymán Bassa was not only a faithful and experienced, but fortunate Commander, and the only fit Man in the Empire to be sent General into Hungary, which the Grand Signior approved of. Solymán had Notice of what was doing, and seeing his own Fate in what had befallen Shaitan Ibrahim, to avoid it, resolved to push for the Intership. He went and call himself at the Grand Signior's Entry, declaring his readiness to lay down his Life in Hungary, or wherever else he pleased, but withal taking the liberty to acquaint him, that whoever went to Hungary without the Seal (that is unless he was Visier) would not be able to do the Imperial service for which he gave many Reasons, and being backed by his Friends, who represented

the then Visier's Infirmities and Daintiness to go to the War, the Grand Signior resolved to make Solymán Visier, and the next day an Officer was sent to Cara Ibrahim, to demand the Seal of him, which the Grand Signior delivered with his own hand to the said Man. Cara Ibrahim went immediately to a private House, and had an allowance given him of 150 Aspers a day, and four days after was ordered to retire to Constantinople, where he staid some time at a House of his on the Bosphorus; He desired leave to go to Mecca, but could not obtain in October last of January, an Order came to the Gainacan Hurto secure the Person, and seize his Estate, the next morning the Janizaries surrounded his House, he was carried Prisoner to the Seraglio and his House was searched, and all his chief Servants seized, in order to discover his Estate. They have not yet found in Money above 5000 Purles, besides his Jewels, but he hath great Revenues in Houses and Lands; Achmet Bassa made General in Hungary, and Abdi Bassa returns to his Government of Buda; and several other Changes have been made. Tockely is again at Liberty, and the Grand Visier has given him Money to raise 2000 Men, and has ordered the Janizaries to assist him. The Grand Visier goes for certain to Hungary; And the Grand Signior will come hither.

Constantinople, April 10. The late Visier Cara Ibrahim after being stripped of all his Estate, was the 18th of the last Month put on board a Gally and sent to Rhodes to remain a prisoner in the Castle there. The present Grand Visier sent him some Money, and a Sable Vest, and the Grand Signior gives him a small allowance for his subsistence. The Grand Signior is expected here in ten Days, and will reside here this Summer; and the Grand Visier will depart about the end of this Month for Belgrade. An Envoy is arrived at Adrianople from Moscow, and with him another from the General of the Cossacks who are subject to the Muscovites; They come to complain of the Tatars, and the Governour of Assacke, a Portrefs of the Turks on the Tanais, for making incursions into the Countries belonging to the Czars, but it is believed they have other business of more secrecy and importance. The French Ambassador is returned from Adrianople, where he has had Audience of the Grand Signior.

Madrid, May 9. The King having diverted himself several days with Hunting at Ataniles, returned the 30th of the last Month to the Buen-Retiro. It is said at Court, that the Marquis de Conflans will be made Viceroy of Galicia, where he served formerly in the Command of Maître de Camp General. The Marquis de Villena parted from hence the first of this month, to go and pass the Campaign in Hungary. We have an account from Cadix, that Six French Men of War, commanded by the Sieur de Villerte, were come into that Bay, and that the Marschal de Belle was on the Coast with the French Fleet under his Command; When these Letters came from Cadix, there were 15 Spanish Men of War ready to sail, and 9 more were fitting out.

Croatia, May 8. While we were expecting the News of the Conclusion of the Offensive and Defensive League with the *Moscovites*, which has been so long talked of; we have an account that the *Czars* not content with the Cession of *Kiev* and *Smolensky*, had made so many other demands, that the Ambassadors of this Crown relolv'd to break off their Negotiation, and to return home, and having by Memorial taken their Leave of the *Czars*, had fixed the day for their departure, but that some of the chief Ministers of that Court had desir'd them to remain there a week longer; we must expect by our next Letters to know what use has been made of that time. The King of *Poland* parted from *Zorkiew* the 25th of the last month for *Jawartha*, intending to pass some days there, and then to go to *Stry*, where part of the Forces are to Rendezvous. The Preparations for the War are carried on with great diligence, but the Campaign will not be opened till about the middle of the next month. A considerable Sum of Money has been lately sent by the Pope's Nuncio to General *Mohla*, who has undertaken to have 12000. *Cossacks* in the Field this Summer. The Advices we receive from the *Ottoman* Territories differ very much, but what seems most certain, is, that the *Turks* rely upon the *Tartars* to give the Forces of this Crown a great diversion this Campaign.

Vienna, May 16. Yesterday arrived here the Elector of *Bavaria* with a Guard of 800 Horse, having been received at *Crembs* by the Count de *Rabnow*, Commissary-General of the Army, and several other Persons of Quality, appointed by the Emperor to attend him at his entering into the Imperial Territories. This-morning his Electoral Highness went to *Neustadt*, where he will stay three or four days, and then go for *Hungary*, to put himself at the Head of the Army which is to act under his Command. The 14th Instant, a Trial was made here of seven great Mortar-pieces, which were embarked the same day for *Hungary*. Vast quantities of Provisions and Ammunition are sent down the *Danube*, to fill the Magazines in the Frontier places from whence the Imperial Forces will be plentifully supplied during the Campaign. General *Caprara* is marching with his Troops from *Upper Hungary* to the General Rendezvous; *Nongatz* is very closely block'd up, and the Count de *Scherffenberg* has taken such care to secure the Passages of *Transylvania*, that the place cannot be relieved from that side. We are told that Lieutenant-General de *Mercy* is abroad again, upon advice that a Body of *Turks* was marching to join the *Serakquier* who had rallied his Troops which escap'd from the late defeat near *Segedin*. The *Hussars* of *Vesprin* having met a Party of *Tartars* not far from *Alba Regalis*, cut them all off, except four, whom they brought Prisoners, with the Booty they had taken to *Vesprin*.

Cologne, May 24. The 20th Instant 450 Men rais'd in the Countrey of *Liege* to recruit the Regiment in the Emperor's Service, commanded by Count *Emanuel de Furstenberg*, pass'd the *Rhine*, and having rested two days at *Durtz*, embark'd there yesterday for *Mentz* and *Frankfort*, from whence they are to march by Land to *Rasthonne*, and there embark again on the *Danube*. The Prince de *Croy*, General of the Imperial Artillery, having been some time here, parted from hence this week for *Hungary*. The Bishop of *Strasbourg*, who has been long expected, arriv'd here this week from

Liege. The Imperial Sub-Commissioners have received new Orders from *Vienna*, but we do not yet know what they are. The Elector of *Mentz* is gone to the Bath at *Embs*; It is still said, that he and the Elector of *Trier* will be very suddenly at *Bonne*, to confer with the Elector of *Cologne* concerning the present Juncture of Affairs. They write from *Strasbourg*, that the *French Troops* are marching to form the Camp on the *Saar*.

Hague, May 28. The *Sieur Raule*, Intendant of the Marine to the Elector of *Brandenburg*, is still here, and has frequent Conferences with the Deputies of this State, and those of the *West-India* Company. The Ships design'd for the *Streights* under the Command of the Count de *Stirum*, sail'd out of the *Texell* on Saturday last. The *Sieur Lelienwort*, who has resid'd some time at the *French Court* in the Quality of Envoy Extraordinary from the King of *Sweden*, is arriv'd here in his return home. The Letters from *Vienna* do all say, that the Campaign will be open'd with the Siege of *Buda*.
