Vienna, May 16. Yesterday arrived heredthe Elector of Bavaria with a Guard of 800 Highe, having been received at Crembs by the Count de Rabnery Commissary General of the Army pand feveral other Persons of Quality, appointed by the Emperor to attend him at his entring into the Imperial Territories, This morning his Electoral Highnels went to Neuffadt, where he will flay three or four days, and then go for Hungary, to put himself at the Head of the Army which is to act under his Command. The 14th Justant a Tryal was made here of leven great Mortar-pieces, which were embarqued the same day for Hungary. Vast quantities of Provisions and Amagunition are lent down the Danube, to fill the Magazines in the Frontier places from whence the Imperial Enres will be plentifully supplied during the Canipagne. General Caprara is marching with his Troops from Opper Hungary to the General Rendezvous; Mongary is very closely blocked up, and the Count de Scherffenberg has taken such care to secure the Passages of Traphipa-ma, that the place cannot be relieved from that side. We are told that Lieutenant-General de Mercy is abroad again, upon advice that a Body of Tarks was marching to join the Serasquier who had rallied his Troops which escaped from the late defeat near Segedin. The Hussars of Vesprin having met a Party of 50 fagizaries not far from Alba Regalis, cut them all off, except four, whom they brought Prisoners with the Booty they had taken to Veftrin. m that ,
