**Manchester and Ashton-under-Lyne New Road.**

Repeal, re-enactment, and amendment of Act.—Removal of existing Trustees.—Appointment of New Trustees.—Restriction on, and regulation of, application of Funds.—Consolidation of Trust with Manchester and Bury-road Trust, or another Trust.—Consolidation of Acts.—Extension of Term.

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that it is intended to apply to Parliament, in the present session, for an Act for all or some of the following purposes:—

1st. To repeal, re-enact, and amend all or some of the provisions of the Manchester and Ashton-under-Lyne New Road Act, 1851.

2ndly. To remove the existing Trustees of that Act, or some of them.

3rdly. To appoint new Trustees of that Act.

4thly. To restrict as from or after the 18th day of March, 1853, or some other day, and during the present session of Parliament, or some other period, the application of all or part of the moneys at the disposal of the Trustees of that Act.

5thly. To regulate the application, as from or after that day, or some other day, of such moneys.

6thly. To consolidate the Trust of that road with the trust of the Manchester and Bury New Road, from Hunt's Bank to Pilkington, or with the trust of some other road in the county palatine of Lancaster.

7thly. To repeal, re-enact, amend, and consolidate all or some of the Acts relating to the trust of the Manchester and Ashton-under-Lyne New Road, and the trust of the Manchester and Bury New Road, or of such other road respectively, or some of the provisions of such Acts.

8thly. To make other provisions with respect to the trust of the Manchester and Ashton-under-Lyne New Road, and the funds and accounts thereof.

9thly. To consolidate the proposed Act, or some

of the provisions thereof, with any Act to be passed in the present session relating to the Manchester and Bury New Road, or such other road.

10thly. To consolidate with the proposed Act, any such other Act, or some of the provisions thereof.

11thly. To extend the term granted by the Manchester and Ashton-under-Lyne New Road Act, 1851.

12thly. To levy tolls, rates, and duties, and to alter existing tolls, rates, and duties, and to confer, vary, and extinguish exemptions from payment of tolls, rates, and duties, and to confer, vary, and extinguish other rights and privileges.
