D Division. No. 14. Uxbridge-road October 25, 1852.	Eighteen Carriages. To commence 10 feet west from the Iron Pump, along the foot-way on the south side, to opposite Stanhope-place.
D Division. No. 10. Oxford-street October 25, 1852.	Fourteen Carriages. To commence opposite No. 199, in centre of street, to No. 218, keeping clear of Nos. 208, 209, and 210.
B Division. No. 1. Buckingham Gate October 30, 1852.	Ten Carriages. To commence from Prince's-court, James's-street, along the curb-stone, to the corner of Stafford-row, Pimlico.
N Division. No. 15. Great William-street, Maiden-lane, Islington November 2, 1852.	Thirty Carriages. To commence 10 feet from the Crossing in Maiden-lane, in centre of street, towards the Caledonian-road.
C Division. No. 9. Piccadilly November 11, 1852.	Seventeen Carriages. To commence opposite the west corner of Sackville-street, in centre of street, to the entrance of Burlington Arcade, keeping clear of the Albany Court-yard.
F Division. No. 8. Strand March 18, 1853.	Nine Carriages. To commence opposite No. 333, in centre of street, to No. 342.
