Vienna, May 26. That at the same time Prince Abafet had joined his Forces with thole commanded by Lieutenant-General Scherffenberg, and that they had attacked the Turks, and defeated them, many of the Enemy being killed, and the rest put to slight. They write from Hungary, that the Turks do affemble near Alba Regalis, that are already 40000 Men, and that they ex-

pected a confiderable Body of Asiaticks.

Francfort, May 28. There will be a meeting of the Deputies of the Circles of Bavaria, Suabia, Pranconia, and the Upper Rhme, the beginning of the next month at Ausburgh, at which the Count de Hohenloe will be present on the part of the Em-The Advices from Hungary say, That the Turks pretend to have a confiderable Army in Croatia this Campagne, and that therefore feveral Imperial Regiments were fent to reinforce the Troops that are thack on that fide under the Command of General Schaltz. The Imperial Army is to Rendezvous the 30th of this month near Barkan, and, it's faid, their first Enterprize will be against Alba Regalis.

Hamb rgh , May 28. We are told from Berlin, That the Elector of Brandenburgh had received an account from Lieutenant-General Schonecke, that he was entred into Hungary with his Electoral Highneffes Forces under his Command, and that he hoped to be with them at the General Rendezvous the 26th of this month. The News we had from Stockholine, That the King of Sueden had resolved to go to Schonen to fee his Troops which he had ordered to encamp near Lundun, is not confirmed. Write from Warfam, That the King of Poland will have 10000 Cuffacks in his Service this Summer,

besides those commanded by Molnila.

Bruffels, June 7. We had yesterday our Spanish Letters, which gave an account that the affair of the 500000 Crowns was adjusted, the Marours de los Balbaces having obliged himself to the French Ambassador to pay that Sum at one pay-ment upon the arrival of the Galeons, and that an Express had been thereupon fent by the said Ambasfador to the Mareschal d'Estrée; to give him notice of what was done, and to defire him to retire with the Ships under his Command from before Calix. We expect to have this News confirmed by our next Letters from Paris, and to hear at the fame time that Orders have been given for the taking off the Seizures on the Spanish Estates in the New Con-The Letters from Vienna of the 26th past tell us, that the General Rendervous was to be the 30th of the last month, but that it was doubted the Duke of Lorrain could flot be prefent at it; by reason of his Indisposition, which had sezen him at Oedenburg; He had had 5 Fits of an Ague, and though he had missed his Fir the day the last Lotters which were of the 22d came from Oedenburg, and that it was droped he would have no more, yet his Physicians did not think fit he should remove from thence in tome days at least. In the mean time

all things were preparing for the opening of the Campagne, which the common Discourse was, would be begun with the Siege of Alba Regalis. The Advices from Hungary say, That the Prince of Transilvania had joined his Forces with those commanded by Lieutenant-General Scherffenberg, and that they had already had some Action with the Turks, whom they defeated, and afterwards posses fed themselves of a Pass called Hermansburg.

Hague, June 11.
