WE, your Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects, the Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland, now met in General Assembly, have received with deep gratitude the gracious letter in which your Majesty has been pleased to express your resolution to countenance our present meeting by the sanction of your royal authority.

We derive great encouragement from the confidence with which your Majesty looks forward to the results of our solemn deliberations, in the expectation of our counsels being guided by the same wisdom, moderation, and anxious care, which distinguished former Assemblies of this National Church in the determination of questions affecting the moral and spiritual welfare of the people of Scotland.

It is highly gratifying to us again to receive the assurance of your Majesty's resolution to uphold and support the Church of Scotland in the full enjoyment of its rights and privileges; and it is our earnest prayer that, through the blessing of the Almighty, we may be enabled to use all the means within our reach to advance the honour and glory of God, by labouring with the utmost fidelity and earnestness for the increase of true religion and virtue among the people of whom we have the oversight.
