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Naples, May 14.

WE have Advice from *Messina*, That the Gallies of *Malta* were arrived there, and that they expected those of the Pope and of the great Duke of *Tuscany* to join with them, that they might together continue their Voyage to the *Levant*, to serve against the *Turks*.

Venice, May 24. The Master of a Vessel which arrived here about the end of the last week from the *Mores*, reports, that there are but 9000 *Turks* in Garrison at *Modon*, and that these are in great want of Provisions, being blocked up by the *Abanians* inhabiting the Mountains, who have possessed themselves of all the Passages that lead to the place. That the *Turks* have reinforced the Garrison of *Naples* with 200 *Janiseries*; And that the Serasquier was posted at *Nixi* with 12000 fighting Men, most Horse. By another Vessel, which came in eight days from the Galle of *Sapientza*, we have Advice that Captain General *Morogini* was arrived with the Fleet at *Petrasso*, where he expected the Convoys that have been sent from hence, and the Auxiliary Gallies. The *Turks*, commanded by the Bassa of *Arcegovina*, after having taken the Fort of *Narin*, encamped on the River *Narenta*, where they were attacked by 800 *Morlaques*, who entered their Camp, and slew divers of the Enemy, but were at last forced to retire with loss. At the same time that the Bassa of *Arcegovina* marched towards *Narin*, the Bassa of *Bassina* took likewise the Field with the Troops under his Command, and marched towards *Sebenico*; but that hindered not the *Morlaques* from surprizing the Fort of *Chanaover*, in which was a Garrison of 100 Men. The Governour of *Sebenico* had a Correspondence in the place, by means whereof the *Morlaques* entered it almost in sight of the said Bassa, and afterwards returned to *Sebenico* with several Prisoners, and a considerable Booty. We are farther told, that the Chevalier *Janco* had made an Incursion with the *Morlaques* under his Command into the Enemies Country, where he burnt four or five Villages, and took 200 Prisoners. The Bassa of *Arcegovina* has, it is said, received Orders to march with his best Troops towards *Hungary*. We have Letters from *Adriaticke* which give an account, that the 12th of April the Grand Visier caused his Tents to be set up without the Gates of that City; that the 17th the Aga of the *Janiseries* began his march towards *Hungary*, and was followed the 19th by the Grand Visier with a Body of Horse. The Prince of *Palma* will part from hence the next week for *Dalmatia*, to command there the Forces of this State.

Jawarow, May 8. The King of *Poland* will part from hence the next week for *Stey*, where the Troops that have had their Quarters on this side are to Rendezvous. The Count *Wiespolske*, Great

Chancellor of this Kingdom, is returned from his Embassy in *France*, of which he has made his report to the King. The Advices from the Frontiers, confirm that the *Turks* are preparing a great Convoy of Provisions at *Jassi*, for the Relief of the Garrison of *Caminiec*, which begins to be in great want thereof. The Letters from *Moscow* of the 27th of *March* say, That the Ambassadors of this Crown continued their Conferences with the Ministers appointed to treat with them, not without hopes of succeeding after all in their Negotiation; The *Moscovites* having offered to enter into the League against the *Turks*, upon condition, that besides *Smolensko* and *Kiovi*, all the Countrey lying along the *Boristhenes* from *Czerni* to the *Black Sea* be yielded to them.

Vienna, May 30. The Elector of *Brandenburg* went from *Aenslade* on Monday last for *Prussia*, and the Duke of *Lorraine* parted from *Ordenburg* the day following. The Prince of *Trautman* has put himself under the Emperor's protection, and the last Letters from those Parts told us, that Prince *Abassi* was sending Ambassadors to the Prince of *Moldavia* and *Valachia*, to exhort them to do the like. These Letters confirm the defeat of the *Rumanians* who came to demand the yearly Tribute the *Rumanians* used to pay the *Turks*, and the taking of *Hermansbourg*; and add, that Prince *Abassi* has yielded two of his principal Fortresses to the Emperor, and that all the Towns which the Count *de Soberssenbergh* had passed in his march, had offered him their Keys, but that he had refused to receive them, contenting himself with taking of them an Oath of Fidelity to the Emperor as their Protector. We have Advice from *Hungary*, that the greatest part of the City of *Belygrade* is burnt down by a Fire that lately hapned there. The Court will return hither the next week from *Nemtsch*. His Imperial Majesty has given the Command of Captain General of *Catinchia*, to the Count *de Rosenburgh*. The Letters from *Bohemia* say, that the 26th of the last Month was appointed for the General Rendezvous of the Forces of that Crown.

Vienna, June 2. We expect to hear by the next Courier from *Hungary*, that the Elector of *Bavaria* and the Duke of *Lorraine* are arrived at the General Rendezvous. We have an account that the Auxiliary Troops of *Saxony* were come to *Leopoldstadt*; but those of *Brandenburg* have not made so much diligence in their march. The Garrison of *Mongatz* are not so closely blocked up; but that they make Incursions into the Countrey, where they have plundered and burnt several Villages. Yesterday arrived here the Son of the Emperor's Resident in *Poland*, with the good News that the League between the *Poles* and the *Moscovites* was at last concluded; That it had been published at *Moscow* with great Solemnity; That the *Czars* have promised to invade this Campaigne the *Crim Tartars*, and to join besides a Body of their Forces with those of the King of *Poland*.

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
