HE Duke of Mantua arrived here the 19th Instant from Rome; The Marquis del Carpio, our Viceroy, having fent one of his chief Officers to receive and compliment him on the Confines of the Kingdoms; and going himself to Aversa, to meet and welcome his Highness, who being Dicognito, would not receive the Honours his Excellency intended him, at his Entring into this

Venice, June 1. The 23d past, being Ascensis. Day, the Doge, accompanied with the Senate, and the Amballadors of the Emperor and of France, performed the accultomed Ceremony of Marrying the Sea; After which, he gave a very plendid Entertainment to the whole Company. The Count de Melgar is arrived here from Milan with the Duke d'Andria. We have an Account from Dalmaria, that the Balla of Bollina; and the Sangiac of Arcoovina, were on their march towards Hungary, not having left above 2000 in their feveral Garifons in D4matia, And that the Morlaques of Sebenico and Cliffs were no fooner informet of it, but they marched out; and attacked the Fortress of Ofto: fi, not far from Sing, which they took, putting 230 Tunks to the Sword, and releating Jabout the fame number of Christians. The Fleet of this State was, according to our last Advice, at Porto Glinne, where the great Convoy that went lately from hence with General Conin I marks and the Prince of Brunfinicke had joined it: All things were ready for the opening of the Campagne, fo that they only flay'd for the Ankillary Gallies. We liave Advice that the Se-rasquier of the Morsa is encamped with 16000 Men between Nixi and Calamata; And that he had fent 600 Greeks to cut down all the Olive Trees about Coron.

Milan, May 28, The Count de Euersalida our Governor, has reformed ten Companies of Foot, and fire Troops of Horle, the Soldiers being put into other Bodies, to complete them. There are now encamped near Pavia, by his Excellencies Order, Eightly Companies of Foot, and Thirty fix Troops.
