Naples, May 23.

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HE Galleys of the great Duke of *Tufcany* arrived the 19th inftant at *Nizita*; The Admiral Guidi, who commands them, came hither and had a private Audience of our Viceroy; and in the Evening the Galleys failed again for Sicie, to joyn with thole of the Pope and of Malta.

Milan, June 4: The Count de Fuenfalida-our Governor, being accompanied with the Maiftre de Camp General, and the General of the Horfe, parted from hence the 30th of the 14ft month for Pavia, to whit the Fortifications of that place, and to take a review of the Troops in Garilon there; and went from thence to Alexandria, Valenca, Torconu and Novare, to give Orders for the repaining the Fortifications of thole places. After his return hither, his Excellency will take a general review of the Horfe in the fervice of this Dutchy.

Venice, June 1. We have an account, by Letters of the 13th of the last Month, That Prince Maximilian of Brunfivick and the Marefchal de Coningfmarke had joyned the Fleet with the laft Convoy that went from hence. That Captain General Movojini had upon their arrival held a Council of War, where it was debated whether they fhould continue to act in the Morea, or go and attack the Turks in fome other parts, but we do not know what Refolutions were taken. The Coptain General had fent a Squadron of Men of War to Po.to Vitulo, with Arms for the Mainotes, who continue to make Incursions into the Enemies Country. The Parties of the Garifon of Coron have lately taken above 30 Prifoners, and feveral Head of Cattle out of the Neighbou hood of Modon, the Turks of that Garifon not daring to fir out of the place to engage them. The fame Letters from the Fleet tell us, That the Marquifs de Courbon and Count Bernubo Viscont: had fought a Duel; That one of them was killed, and the other taken as he endeavoured to make his Efcape. The laft Advices from Dalmatia faid, That the Morlaques, Commanded by the Chevalier Janco, were returned from a new Incursion they had made into the Territory of Licca, where they had burnt feveral Villages, and got a rich Booty. The Privateers of Cattaro have taken a Veffel of Dulcigno, in which were 30 Turks who were all made Prifoners. This Day happened here a Fire in the Quarter of Sti John and St. Paul, And a great many Houses were burnt.

Marfeilles, June 14. We have advice by a Bark of this place, which arrived here yesterday from Sally, that an Algierine had lately taken a Ship of about 200 Tuns, belonging to St. Malo, bound hither with Poor-Jack, and having funk the Vessel with her Lading, carried the Mep and fome fine Goods they found on board, to Sally 5, but the French Conful there demanded the Men of the Governor, and obtained, it's faid, an Order to have them put into his hands. The King of Poland intends to part from hence to morrow for Stry, on the Frontiers of Hungary, whither it's fail forme Officers are fent by the Emperor to confer with his Majefly concerning the defigns of the Campagne. The Freiops of this Crown are marching to the general Rendezvo is, which will not be held till towards the middle of the next month, for that there will not be Forage fooner for the Horfe. The Tatar continue to infeft the Frontier Provinces of this Kingdom with their Incurfichs.

Vienna, June 6. All the General's are now with the Army, which was to findezvous yefterday near Barkan; "Phe Auxiliard Troops of Savony are ani-ved there's but though of Brandenburg; who march very flowly, cannot be there? yet in fome days; The Count de Dimenvalde is gone by the Emperor's Order towards the Frontiers of Silefia to haften their march. It is not yet known whether the Campagne will be begun with the Siege of Buda, or Alba Regalu. The first of these Places, as we are informed by fome Perfons who are lately come from thence, is in a very good Condition; The old Fortifications are repaired, and fome new ones built near the Danube; The Ditches are made larger and deem; They have unpaved the Streets, and covered their Houses with Earth to hinder the effect of our BomLs and Carcaffes: In the middle of the Piece is a great Ciftern of Water, encompassed with a high Wall; The Garifon confilts of 10000 7 mizaries and \$pabe, all cholen Men, Commanded by fix Baffa's, and is provided with Ammunition and Providions fufficient to Support a Siege of Six Months. Some Detachements of the Garifons of Raab, Commit and Velprin, made the laft Week an Excussion as fir as Buds, from whence they returned with feveral Pri-foners, and a confiderable Booty. The Letters from Upper Hungary tell us, That Teche ev is with 5000 Men near Teme/under, and that the Turks are drawing their Troops fogether to give the Imperialifts a Diversion on that fide. We have advice, That part of the Ottoman Forces have passed the Bridge of Effocke ; but we do not yet hear that the Grand Viffer is arrived at Belgrade.

Vienna, June 9. Their Imperial Majeflies are returned hither from Neurflade. The Elector of Bavaria artived laft Monday at Comora; And the Duke of Lorrain the next day at Raab, from whence they continued their Journey to the general Rendezvousnear Backan. The Auxiliary Troops of Sumbia are at the Rendezvous, but thole of Brandenb 19 will not be there till the 14 or 15 of this month. We have advice that the Baffa of Alba Regalis fearing a Siege, hath burnt the Suburbs of that place. There
