ART. 2. That a copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.

#### Repeal of the Islington Cattle Market Act.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing session for an Act to repeal an Act made and passed in the session of Parliament, held in the 5th and 6th years of the reign of His late Majesty, King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for establishing a Market for the Sale of Cattle in the parish of Saint Mary, Islington, in the county of Middlesex," and for extinguishing all right and power of holding the said market, and of levying, collecting, and receiving tolls, rates, and duties, and all other powers, rights, and privileges, conferred or given by the said Act; and for enabling the site of the said cattle market and all stables, stalls, sheds, houses, pens, outhouses, beast houses, and other buildings, roads, ways, lands, tenements, hereditaments, and premises belonging or appurtenant to the said cattle market, to be used and converted for or to other purposes, and for vesting the said site of the said cattle market, buildings, roads, ways, lands, tenements, hereditaments, and premises belonging or appurtenant to the said cattle market, including those acquired under the powers of the said Act of the 5th and 6th of William the Fourth, in the owner or owners thereof for the time being in fee simple, discharged of all liability to hold the said market, and all other liabilities under the said Act, and also for other purposes.—Dated this 14th day of October, 1853.

#### Bolton Gas.

(Amendment of Act, Increase of Capital, and Extension of Powers.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the next session for an Act to alter, amend, and enlarge the powers and provisions of an Act passed in the sixth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act for more effectually lighting with gas the borough of Bolton and certain places adjacent thereto, in the county of Lancaster," or to repeal the said Act and to grant further, better and more effectual powers instead thereof; and to incorporate, if needful, in such Act all or some of the provisions of "The Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," and "The Gasworks Clauses Consolidation Act, 1847;" and it is proposed by the said intended Act to confer upon the Company incorporated by the said Act of the sixth year of Her present Majesty, or which may be incorporated by the said intended Act, all necessary powers for manufacturing and supplying gas within the whole of the

parliamentary borough of Bolton aforesaid, and the several parishes, townships, or places following (that is to say), the townships, hamlets, or places of Tonge-with-Haulgh, Tonge, Darcy-Lever, Little Lever, Bradshaw, Turton, Lostock, and Sharples-lower-End, in the parish of Bolton-le-Moors, the township of Great Lever, in the parish of Middleton, and the townships of Farnworth, Kearsley, Middle Hulton, Rumworth, Halliwell, Heaton, and Horwich, in the parish of Deane, all in the said county palatine of Lancaster, and in which it may be necessary or proper to lay down, construct and maintain mains, pipes and other works for affording such supply of gas; and to authorize the Company incorporated or to be incorporated as aforesaid to sell and dispose of coke, and all and every product and products, refuse or residum arising or to be obtained from the materials used in or necessary for the manufacture of gas; and it is proposed by the said intended Act to extinguish the liability of the said Company to provide lights for certain lamps erected by the trustees of Great Bolton and Little Bolton respectively, as provided by the said Act of the sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, and all other rights and privileges conferred by the said Act, and to confer other rights and privileges; and it is proposed by the said Act to authorize the Company incorporated, or to be incorporated as aforesaid, to raise, by the creation of shares and by mortgage or bond, further sums of money, and to augment their capital by the creation of shares or otherwise; and to contract or agree with any body or bodies politic or corporate, person or persons, for lighting or supplying with gas the several roads, streets, ways, lanes, bridges, or other public or private passages and places, churches, chapels, manufactories, shops, warehouses, houses, or other buildings within the said borough, parishes, townships, and places, or any of them, and to levy rents and charges for the supply of gas within the said borough, parishes, townships, and places; and to alter existing rents and charges, and to confer, vary, or extinguish exemptions from payment of rents and charges; and to purchase lands and buildings by agreement for the purposes of their works.
