[The following Order in Council is substituted for that which appeared in the Gazette of Tuesday last.]

AT the Court at Windsor, the 25th day of November, 1853.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament, held in the ninth and tenth years of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled "An Act for the more easy recovery of small debts and demands in England," it is among other things enacted, that it should be lawful for Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council to order that the said Act be put in force in such county or counties as to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, from time to time, should seem fit, and to divide the whole or part of any such county (including all counties of cities and counties of towns, cities, boroughs, towns, ports, and places, liberties and franchises therein contained or thereunto adjoining), into districts, and to order that the County Court should be holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act, in each of such districts, and from time to time to alter such districts as to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, should seem fit, and to order, from time to time, that the number of districts, in and for which the Court should be holden, should be increased until the whole of such county should be within the provisions of the said Act, and, with the advice aforesaid, to alter the place of holding of any such Court, or to order that the holding of any such Court should be discontinued, or to consolidate any two or more of such districts, and, from time to time, with the advice aforesaid, to declare by what name and in what towns and places the County Court should be holden in each district :

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by an Order in Council, of the ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, to order that the said Act should be put in force in the counties and places therein specified, among which counties the county of Stafford was included, and the town of Hanley was named as a place for holding one of the Courts of the said county of Stafford for the district in that behalf particularly mentioned in the said Order :

And whereas by certain other Acts made and passed in the thirteenth, in the fourteenth, and in the sixteenth years of the reign of Her

Majesty, the provisions of the said recited Act have been amended and extended :

And whereas it hath been represented that it would be of advantage to the public that a County Court should be holden at Stoke-upon-Trent, in the county of Stafford, for the parishes and places thereunto adjacent, and which parishes and adjoining places are, by virtue of the said Order, now within the district of the County Court holden at the town of Hanley :

Her Majesty having taken the premises into consideration, is thereupon pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the thirty-first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four—

The parish of Trentham, the townships of Longton, Lane End, Fenton Culvert otherwise Great Fenton, Fenton Vivian otherwise Little Fenton, Penkhull, and Boothen, and such part of the township of Shelton as comprises any part of the glebe lands now belonging to the Rector of Stoke-upon-Trent, or any lands which, on the twentieth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, were parcel of the glebe lands of the Rector of Stoke-upon-Trent aforesaid, and which parish, townships, and glebe lands are now in the district of the County Court of Staffordshire, holden at Hanley, shall cease to be within the district of the said Court, holden at Hanley, and shall form the district of a County Court to be holden at Stoke-upon-Trent ; and a County Court for the purposes of the above-mentioned Acts shall accordingly, from and after such day, be held at Stoke-upon-Trent aforesaid, by the name of the County Court of Staffordshire, holden at Stoke-upon-Trent, for the parish of Trentham, the townships of Longton, Lane End, Fenton Culvert otherwise Great Fenton, Fenton Vivian otherwise Little Fenton, Penkhull, and Boothen, and for such part of the township of Shelton as comprises any part of the glebe lands now belonging to the Rector of Stoke-upon-Trent, or any lands which, on the twentieth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, were parcel of the glebe lands of the Rector of Stoke-upon-Trent aforesaid.

Her Majesty has also been pleased to re-constitute the Bishopric of Cape Town, and to direct that the same shall comprise the western districts of the colony of the Cape of Good Hope, consisting of the divisions of the Cape, Stellenbosch, Caledon, Swellendam, George, Beaufort, the Paarl, Worcester, Malmesbury, and Clanwilliam, and all portions of the colony of the Cape, not comprised in these divisions lying south of the Orange, and west of the Ongars Rivers, and also the island of St. Helena, and be called, "The bishoprick of Cape Town;" and Her Majesty has appointed the Right Reverend Father in God, Doctor Robert Gray, to be bishop of the said see of Cape Town; and to be Metropolitan Bishop in the said colony of the Cape of Good Hope and its dependencies, and in the island of St. Helena; and Her Majesty has further appointed that the Bishops of Graham's Town and of Natal shall be suffragan bishops to the said Bishop of Cape Town.

Her Majesty has further been pleased to appoint the Right Reverend the Bishop of Sierra Leone to be a Member of the Council of that colony.

Port of Lynn.

Limits of Port and Legal Quays,

WE, the undersigned, Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, do hereby, under the authority of "The Customs Consolidation Act, 1853," appoint Lynn to be a Port in that part of the United Kingdom called England, and we do hereby declare that the limits of the said port shall commence on the northern side of the bridge across the Exu Brink Cut, called the Free Bridge, in the county of Norfolk, and from thence proceed along and include the whole of the River Ouse, to its termination in Lynn Deep; thence, in a north and east direction, along the coast of the said county, to a place called Brancaster Staith, in the said county; and from thence, in a supposed straight line, to sea, in a north-westerly direction, to fourteen fathoms water; thence, in a supposed straight line, in a south-westerly direction, to a place called Lutton Sluice, in the county of Lincoln; thence, in a south-easterly direction, along a supposed straight line, drawn from Lutton Sluice aforesaid, to Terrington Church, in the aforesaid county of Norfolk, and so along the coast of the said county of Norfolk to the western side of the said River Ouse; and shall include all rivers, bays, harbours, fleets, and creeks within the said port, communicating with or discharging themselves within the said limits.

And we, the said Lords Commissioners, do hereby appoint and declare so much of that open place, quay, or wharf, at Lynn Regis, in the county of Norfolk aforesaid, known as the Marine-parade, extending in length, from north to south, ten hundred and forty-one feet, and bounded by a stone sunk therein at each end thereof, with the letters L 2 thereon respectively, the said quay being also of the uniform breadth of twenty-six feet, to be a Legal Quay within the said port for the lading and unlading of goods.

Also all that other open place, at Lynn aforesaid, called King Staith, being in length sixty-three feet, and in breadth one hundred and twenty-three feet, including a passage nine feet wide, opening on the north into Purfleet.

Also all that other open place, at Lynn aforesaid, called Purfleet Quay, being in length two hundred and thirty-five feet, and in breadth forty feet.

And also all that other open place, at Lynn aforesaid, called Common Staith, being in length three hundred and forty-eight feet, and in breadth seventy-three feet.

And we, the said Lords Commissioners, do hereby annul all former limits of the said Port of Lynn, and all former quays set out and appointed within the said port.

Limits of Port and Legal Quays.

WE, the undersigned, Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, do hereby, under the authority of "The Consolidated Customs Act, 1853," appoint Wells to be a Port in that part of the United Kingdom called England; and we do hereby declare that the limits of the said port shall commence at Sand Hole Gap, about half a mile to the westward of Brancaster Channel, and shall extend from thence, in an easterly direction along

the coast, to Sparrow Gap, a breach in the cliff, about halfway between Weybourne and Steningham, and shall include all rivers, bays, harbours, and creeks within the said limits, and shall extend out to sea a distance of three miles from low-water mark along the coast within the aforesaid limits.
