Ratisbonne, June 24. The Colledge of Prin-'ces affembled extraordinarily the 18th of this month, the Subject of their Debate, we are told, related to the Conference which will begin in few days at Aufbourg. In the mean time the Electoral Colledge have renewed their Inftances to the Princes and States of the Empire, to deliberate concerning the Execution of the Treaty of Truce, the Regulating the Limits, and other important Points which con-cern the Peace and Security of the Empire. The Ministers refiding at the Dyet on the part of the Kings 'of Spain and Sueden, and the Elector of Bavaria, are gone to the meeting at Ausbourg. The laft Advices from the Imperial Army, commanded by the Duke of Lorrain, left them Encamped not far from Buda, which, it's believed, was invested the 17th or 18th of this month; There is a very good Gari-fon in the place, and the Turks have not been wanting to provide all things necellary for the defence of k. There is yet no News of the Grand Vifier's arrival at Belgrade, which makes People begin to believe, that the Reports of his intention to command the Ottoman Army in Perfon this Campagne , have been only fpread abroad to encourage the Soldiers, and to prevent the Diforders which were feared at Adrianopland Constantinople. We are told from Upper Hungary, That the Garifon in Mongatz is very much weakned, the Hungarians as well as Ger mans (who find Provisions grow very fcarce, and that Teckeley is not able to make good his promiles to relieve them) deferting daily.

Francfort, June 20. There will be a Meeting the next week at Ausbargh of the Deputies of Bavaria, Suabra, Franconia, and the Upper Rhine, at which will be prefent the Ministers of Spain and Sweden, and the Count de Hehenlos on the part of the Emperor.

Cologne, June 26. The Imperial Sub-Commiffe oners are full here; but it's believed they will now in a thort time have finished their Committion. The Letters from Hungary fay, that the Imperial Army was before Buda.

Hamburgh, June 24. The Baron Hermare, the Imperial Minister, is come hither from Zell, where he has been feveral months, endeavouring to contpole the differences, between the Duke of Zell and this City. He has, fince his Arrival, had a Conference with these Magistrates, to whom, it's faidy he has made fome new Propofals, but we do not hear with what fuccels. There remain ftill great difficulties which hinder an Accommodation, though we are not without hopes, that by the good offices of the Princes who employ their Mediation, they will be at last removed, and all matters amicably compofed.
