Fulbeck Corn Rent.

PURSUANT to an Act of Parliament, made and passed in the forty-fourth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for inclosing lands within the manor and parish of Fulbeck, in the county of Lincoln, and for making compensation for the tythes arising within the same parish," we, whose names are hereunder written, owners and proprietors of lands within the said parish of Fulbeck, liable to the payment of part of the yearly corn or tythe rent payable to the Rev. Edward Fane, Rector of the said parish of Fulbeck, and his successors, under or by virtue of the award of the Commissioners named and appointed in and by or acting under or by virtue of the said Act, do hereby give notice, that we intend to apply at the next General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, to be

holden for the parts or division of Kesteven, in the said county of Lincoln, to wit, at the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace to be holden at Bourn, in and for the said parts, on Monday the third day of April now next ensuing, to have two persons named and appointed for the said parish of Fulbeck, by the Justices then and there assembled, to be together with a third person to be named, and chosen by such two persons respectively, arbitrators or referees for enquiring into and ascertaining by and from, or by means of, the London Gazette, so long as the return of the average prices of corn and grain shall be published therein, and in case of no such publication, then by such ways or means as they shall think equitable or proper, the average price of a Winchester bushel of good marketable wheat, within the said county of Lincoln, for the twelve years then last past, so that the said corn or tythe rent may be increased or diminished pursuant to and in conformity with the provisions and directions of the said Act.—Dated the 16th day of January, 1854.
