CLAIMS BY BRITISH SUBJECTS ON THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES.

WHEREAS by a Convention between Her Majesty and the United States of America, signed on the 8th of February, 1853, for the settlement of outstanding claims by a Mixed Commission, it is agreed that all claims on the part of subjects of Her Majesty upon the Government of the United States, and all claims on the part of citizens of the United States upon the Government of Her Majesty which may have been presented to either Government for its interposition with the other, since the 24th December, 1814, and which remain unsettled, as well as any other such claims which may be presented within the time specified in the said Convention, shall be referred to two Commissioners for their final determination:

Notice is hereby given, that all British subjects who, since the said 24th day of December, 1814, have presented to the British Government for its interposition with that of the United States, claims which yet remain unsettled and which they desire to have laid before the Commissioners under the said Convention, are required to notify such desire to the Agent of Her Majesty's Government under the said Convention; and to transmit to him forthwith any further statements or particulars of their claims, together with the documentary evidence necessary to support them.

It is further provided by the said Convention, that all claims shall be presented to the Commissioners within six months from the day of their first meeting, which was held on the 14th September, 1853, unless under special circumstances, to be proved to the satisfaction of the Commissioners, in which case the time may be extended to any time not exceeding three months.

All claims not presented within the periods above-mentioned, will be considered as barred.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, copies of two Despatches from Her Majesty's Ambassador, at Paris, enclosing two Imperial Decrees, the one authorizing foreign ships to trade between France and Algeria; the other extending till 31st July, 1854, the coasting trade facilities granted to foreign ships, of which the following are translations:

Art. I. The privilege granted by the Decree of the 30th September, 1853, to foreign vessels to carry, until 31st December, 1853, corn, meal, rice, potatoes, and dry vegetables, between Algeria and France, is extended to 31st July, 1854.

Art. II. Whatever may be the date of their arrival at their destination, foreign vessels thus laden shall enjoy the benefit of the above Article, provided they shall have quitted the port of departure previous to 31st July, 1854.

Art. III. Our Ministers of War, of Commerce, and of Finance, are charged, each in his own Department, with the execution of the present Decree.

Art. I. The privilege granted by our Decree of 12th October, 1853, to foreign vessels to carry from one sea to another, coastwise, grain and other provisions loaded in a French port, is ex-

The above privilege, which is to extend to the 31st July, 1854, shall only be applicable to vessels laden exclusively with grain and the other provisions specified in the Decree of 12th October last.

Art. II. Vessels thus laden shall be admitted at their port of destination at whatever date they may arrive, if their clearance papers shall prove that they sailed previous to the 31st July, 1854.

Art. III. Our Ministers of Agriculture, Commerce, and Public Works, and of Finance, are charged, each in his own Department, with the execution of the present Decree.

Lighthouse on Cape Prior.

Province of Corunna.

From the 1st of March, of the present year, a new lighthouse, established on the "north side of

Cape Prior," will be lighted every night, from sunset to sunrise.

This lighthouse lies in—

43° 33' 40" N. latitude, and
2° 6' 52" W. longitude from the Observa-
tory of San Fernando.

Its apparatus is of the third catadioptrical order, with a permanent light, grand model. The elevation of the luminous focus above the level of the sea is of 136.5 metres (489.87 feet), and produces a tangent of 24 miles, although it will only be visible at a distance of about 15 miles, according to the state of the atmosphere and the elevation of the observer.
