Vinice; June 22. We have Advice both by the way of Evron and Ouranto, that the Pope's Gallies and those of Malea having joined the Fleet of this State at the General Rendezvons, the Captain-General, unwilling to lose time in staying for the Soutadron of Tuscany, set Sail with a Fleet of 80 Ships, 14 Galeases, 40 Gallies, and 12 Galliots, and took his Course towards' Lepanto, seigning a design to attack that Fortiels, hear which he landed 1000 Men to alarm the Countrey, and leaving there six Gallies, two Galeasses, and two Men of War, sailed the Night following with the rest of the Fleet towards Modon, to bessege that place of Navarino; In which we are took there are very weak Garisons; the Turks having drawn all their Forces towards Lepanco. The Letter's from Ouranco sarther tell us, That the Outstant Fleet, consisting in 44 Gallies, and 20 Men of War, funder the Command of the Captain Bassa, was gone to meet a great Convoy from Expe, and that Captail General Marsin having Advice of it, had sent 17 of his best Men of War to intercept the said Convoy.

Stockbalm, June 19. Yesterday about Nine in the Morning a Fire broke out in that part of this City called the Norder Malme, which continued with great sury 28 Hours, and burnt down most of the Houses in that quarter which were about 2000; a great many persons were builded in the Ruins. The Men of War that are fitting out at Carlscron and in other Ports of this Kingdom, will

From the Imperial Camp before Buda, June 19. The Cavalry detached by the Duke of Lorrain invested Buda the 17th instant; Their Vanguard took a Chiaux, who was going thither with a guard of 40 Horse. Yesterday in the Evening the Duke of Lorrain came with the whole Army before the Place; and this day the Troops took their several Posts, and began to work on the Lines of Circumvallation; The Garison faluted them with their Cannon, which did no other harm than to kill one Man. The Turks in Pest, upon notice of the march of the Elector of Bavaria, abandoned that place, and having blown up part of the Walls, retired with their Cannon, Ammunition, Sie. to Buda, breaking down the Bridge so soon as they had passed it, but in the disorder of their retreat, an Aga and 30 Janisaries were left behind, and taken prisoners by the Bavarians. The Elector having put a good Garison into Pesty and detached Major-General Steindu with 6000 Men to attack Hatwan, marched with his Army typas the

We do not hear of any Body of Men the Turks have yet in the Field, unless it be in Upper Hangary, where the Serasquier does draw together what Forces he can between Great Waradin and Temelipaer, to give the Imperialists a Diversion. General Caraffa is posted with the Troops under his Command on the Theys near Zolnocke, to observe the Enemy; and it's faid, Orders have been fent to Lieutenant-General Scherffenberg, who is now in Transilvania with 7 of 8,000 Men, to join with hini,

From the Imperial Camp before Buda, June 23. The 19th Instant we set down before this Place. The 20th, the several Quarters were assigned; The Duke of Ligrains is in the same place where it was two years ago, but General Starenberg has taken his in a more advantageous place; There was a little Skirmish with the Enemy towards the Vienna, Gate, but it lasted not long; We opened the Lines of Chrounvallation, began to trace the first places

of Aims, and marked out three Batteries. The same day the Bridge over the Danube at the Isle of St. andrew was finished. The 21, the Elector of Bavarii passed the River there. The 32d, he arrived in the Camp, and took his Post in the same place where he had it in the former Siege, Cannon, Mortars, and Ammunition were brought into the Camp, and the Trenches were opened muchnearer the Town than formerly; There will be three Attacks, the first under the direction of the Elector of Bavaria, the second commanded Ly General Sturenberg, and the third will be carried on by the Troops of Saxony and Brandenburgh, to whom will be joined fome Imperial Regiments This day, being the 23d, we began to raile our Batteries. The Company of Miners of Flanders, commanded by Captain Channe is arrived in the Camp. The Besieged have not yet made any Sally to hinder our Workmen. According to the Information of the Prisoners, there are in the place bit 7000 January, and 1600 Spahes, besides 3000 of the Inhabitants, who are obliged to hear Arms, but they are provided with Provisions and Ammunition for a long Siege. Vienna, June 27. The Elector of Bavaria has ving passed the Danibe at the Isle of Sr. Andrew, joined the 22d Instant the Imperial Army before Buda. where the Brandenburgh Forces are likewise arrived. The same day the Imperialists opened their Trenches. The 23d, at Night, they attackt the Lower Town, against which they had planted several pieces of Cannon, and made themselves Masters of it, the Turks, after some resistance, retiring into the Caftle or Upper Town. That Night the Befleged made a Sally, but were beaten back with confiderable loss; on our fide were killed a Knight of Mar., a Lieutenant, and eight Volunteers, and fome others wounded. The Turks at Buda having, upon the approach of the Imperial Army, embarked all their Riches, with the Wives and Children of the most confiderable Officers, on 14 Vessels, to transport them to Be'grade, upon Advice of it, the Hungarians, commanded by the Count de Budioni, purfited them, and having beaten the Convoy they had with them, took the whole Booty, confifting in Jewels, Plate, Money, rich Housholdstuff, &c. They write from Cpper Hungary, That Teckeley attempt ing to enter into Transilvania with 3000 Men, had been met and defeated by the Imperalists; That 300 of his Men were killed upon the place, and mahy taken Priloners, himself escaping very harrowly.

Hamburgh, July 2. The King of Denthark is arrived at Gottorp, and intends to go from thence

to Gluck stadt and O'denburg.

Brussel, July 5. The Count de Clermons parted from hence this day for the Hague, to reside there in the Quality of Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Spain. Our Letters from Vienna inform us, that the Imperialists had taken several Prifoners, who all agreed in their Report, that the Tarks did not believe the Christians would have undertaken the Siege of that place, but thought their design was upon Agria, or Asia Regalis; And shat the principal Inhabitants of those places, had sent their Wives and Children, and richest Moveables to Butla; That the Visier of Buda, so soon as he heard that the Imperial Army advanced on both sides the River towards that place, sent Expresses of demand assistance from the Neighbouring Garisons, but too late, the Town being soon after invested. We are assisted that the Garsson does not exceed 9000 Men. It is written satther, That so soon as the Lines of Circumvallation and Contravallation are sinished, greatest part of the Imperial Cavalry will

march towards the Bridge of Effecke, to try to burn it.
