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B Leghorna, June 21. A Bark arriv'd in this Port in 18 days from Tripoli, we have Advice that the two Brothers *Beys* *Hafsa* and *Achmet*, have at last taken the City of *Tunis*. The Success they had received from *Algiers*, put them into a condition to press the Siege very vigorously. On the other side the Besieged were reduced to great necessities, being shut up as well by Sea as Land; And there were besides great Divisions among the principal Commanders of the Militia, which was augmented by the secret Intelligence the *Beys* had within the place. Several Proposals of an Accommodation had been made, which the Day would not hear of; At last the Militia and the chief of the *Divan* being wearied with the length of the Siege, pressed him to yield, which he refusing, they secretly treated with the *Beys*, and opened the Gates to them, who thus became Masters of the Town without any loss. The *Beys* endeavoured to escape, but was taken Prisoner by the Troops of *Algiers*.

Tenice, June 25. We have had no Letters from the Fleet, since those which gave an Account that the Captain General, after having landed 1000 Men near *Spina*, to alarm the Enemy on that side, had taken his Course towards *Modon*; We expect every hour further Advice, which we believe will tell us, that that place or *Nadirino* is besieged. There are Letters from *Smirna* of the 16th of the last month, which say, that the Grand Signior arriv'd at *Constantinople* the 28th of *April*; And that to pacifie the People, he had caused the *Caimacan* of that City to be put into the Seven Towers; and the late Grand Officer, who was a Prisoner at *Rhodes*, to be hanged; They write, from *Galynia*; that the Provveditor General *Cornaro* had drawn a Party of Men together to observe the *Turks*, who were encamp'd near *Narenta*; And from the *Albans*, that the parties of the Garrison of *Garon* do give the Enemy great disturbance; with their frequent incursions, from which for the most part they bring back very good Booty. The Count *de Melgny* is still here preparing for his march to *Rome*. The Privateers of *Cattaro* have lately taken a Vessel of *Dulcigno*, in which were 40 *Turks* who were all made prisoners. We have Advice from *Spain*; That the *Marquis* *Commanche*, by the Chevalier *Sanco* were returned from a successful for they had made into the Territory of *Leres*, where they had burnt several Villages, and got a great deal of Plunder. The Senate have made

choice of Signior *Gio Pittano* to go Ambassador from this Republick to the King of *Spain*. *Genoa*, June 25. The Senate having notice the last week, that two *English* Barks had been seen off the Coast, ordered that four Gallies should sail immediately in search of them. The News of the taking of *Alger* by the *Beys* is confirm'd. We have Advice by a Vessel arriv'd from the *Levant*, that the Grand Signior was come with his whole Court to *Constantinople*.

Milan, June 25. The Count *de Fiesolida* our Governor, has appointed a general Review of the Forces in the service of this Duchy, after which the Troops that are encamp'd near *Pavia* will separate, and return to their respective Quarters.

Madrid, June 20. The King has, upon the death of the Prince *de Chimay* Viceroy of *Navarre*, given that Government to the Duke *de Borbone* *v. de*. The Marquis *de la Ermita* is made Commissary General of this Kingdom, in the place of *Don Melchior Porcarrero*, who is advanced to the Viceroyship of *Mexico*. His Catholick Majesty has named *Don Mamel de Colonia* to reside in Quality of his Envoy Extraordinary at the *Hague*, and he is preparing for his Journey.

Lemburg, June 16. The Train of Artillery consisting in 40 pieces of Cannon great and small, and 14 Mortars, began its march this week towards the general Rendezvous which is appointed near *Trembowin*. The King of Poland will be there about the 20th of this month, and it's not doubted but the Campaign will be opened before the end of it. The *Popes* Nuncio has provided Magazines of several sorts of Ammunition, and has besides erected Hospitals to receive the sick and wounded. We are told that the *Turks* are much alarm'd at the news they have received of the League between this Crown and the *Czar* of *Moscovy*; and that their Chancellors the *Polish* countermanded the Forces that were marching to join with the *Turks*; but this will need a confirmation.

Stry, June 19. The King of Poland arriv'd here the last week from *Janow*; he has taken a Review of the Troops that are encamp'd near this place; and we are told he will march day or two more at the head of them towards *Trembowin*. The General of *Lithuania* has again written to his Majesty, to acquaint him that the Forces of that Duchy are on their march to join with those of the Crown. The *Polish* Troops have possess'd themselves of *Burr* and *Milidun*; which places the *Turks* as we have already told you had abandoned to reinforce the Garrison of *Czarnobro*.
