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Genoa, June 29.

Yesterday arrived here the Admiral Galley of this State in 20 days from Palermo, having met off of Corfica three Ships who put out Dutch Colours upon which the Galley made up towards the least of them, and came within Musket shot, when the Ship fired a broad side with a volley of small shot, all the Cannon bullets went over the Galley, but the Musket shot wounded several Men; The Genesefes discovering by this Time that these Ships were Algerines, took themselves to their Oars, the weather being very calm, and got into Porto Hercules. They have done much mischief on this Coast, it's eight days since the Senate sent out four of their best Gallies, commanded by Signior *Amiraglia Imperiale*, upon the advice they had that several Turkish Brigantines were cruising about Corsica. By a Bark arrived in this Port in 8 days from Tivane, we are informed that things are very quiet at Tunis, the elder Brother commanding in the City, and the younger in the Camp, but it's believed they will not long stay. The late Bey of Tunis being taken in his flight, was sent to Algiers, where they intend, as he said, to keep him, till they have the Grand Signior's Orders concerning him.

Lejhorie, July 14 We have Advice that three Algerine Men of War are Chrising between this place and Genoa; That they have taken several Vessels; and that the Admiral Galley of Genoa which came from Palermo with Silks, had like to have fallen into their hands; but with the help of her Oars, the weather being calm, she escaped them. It's reported that they have taken seven Passengers, being Spaniards and Italians, out of a French Tartane that was going to Cagliari.

Venice, July 6. *Te Deum* has been sung in the Church of St. Mark, at which the Doge and the whole Senate assisted, for the late Victory obtained in the Morea, and the taking the two Forerelles Old and New Navarino by the Forces of this Republick. We have Letters from Constantinople of the 20th of May, which give an account that the Grand Signior arrived there from Adrianople the 25th of April, and that some few days after he sent a *Chiaus* to Rhodes to fetch the Head of the late Vizier *Cara Ibrahim* who was a prisoner there, and caused the *Camerlengo* of Constantinople, and three Bassa's upon the complaints that were made against them, to be strangled; and that the Spensker of the Morea was in danger of a like Treatment, being accused of ill Conduct and Cowardice. Who, to justify himself, had written to the Grand Visier, acquainting him with the weakness of the For-

ces under his Command, and the advantage he pretends to have over the Christians. The Christians in several occasions, and demanding very earnestly a speedy assistance also that by the loss of otherwise be able to keep the Christian of the Levant wadd that the Muslim Leges that have been made within the Ottoman Empire for the service of this Campaign, may be very short of what was intended to be raised, and that besides, they defected at their march, by the *Amiraglia* whole Troop, and was reported that the Grand Signior had ordered (should he go and pass) some time past, that he should go with his Frigate to Algiers, and that Monsieur *Tourville* arrived there the 15th Instant with 15 Ships, and Duke of *Alger* is being gone with his Frigate to Algiers, and the *Tripoliti* in his Troop.

Madrid July 3. The Duke de *Bejar* is declared Viceroi of Navarre upon the death of the Prince de *Chimani*; but the Viceroyship of *Andalusia* vacant for the removal of *Don Juan de Austria* to the Government of *Andalusia* is not yet proposed. The Letters from Cadix inform us, that the French Fleet was retires to Cadix, and that dividing into two Squadrons, the one entered into the *Streight*, and the other took its course towards *Cape Sprinay*, to adjust some differences the French have with the *Spanish* Fleet sailed from Cadix homewards, before they Letters came away, towards *St. Vincent*, to meet the *English* that are expected from the *West Indies*. We have advice of their departing from *Porto Colera* about last night, though the Fleet they signed thither, will hardly be able to part from *Cadix* this year, so that only two Gallions will be sent away with the *Quicksilver* that's necessary for the working the Mines; and that Don *Alonso* *Porto Carrero* Viceroy of Mexico will take his passage with them.

Warsaw July 1. We have an account from *Seray*, that the King of *Poland* parted from thence the 23 of the last Month, to quit himself at the head of his Army; and that he had sent Orders to the Castellain of *Chelm* to block up *Gumniec* with the Troops he has under his Command; from whence many conjecture, that his Majesty's resolution is to besiege this important Fort. It here is a good Garrison to be had, and it is not furnished with Provisions of Ammunition for a long defence. The Train of Artillery, composed of 50 pieces of Cannon and Mortars was arrived at the General Rendezvous; where the Forces of *Lithuania* were daily expected to join with those of the Crown. The King having advice, that a Body of 7 or 8000 *Tatars* advanced towards the Frontiers of this Kingdom, had sent out a strong detachment to observe them.
