Ount Leflie Ma-Rince Louis of Ba refchal de Camp den. General! General Caraffa,

from Alexandria. Leghorne, June 26. The Algerines have taken le-veral Merchants Ships on these Coafts, whom they surprized by carrying Dutch Colours; They have likewith taken two Barks belonging to Geneur and flave vifited a French Tartane that was going from Portofino to Capliari; and took out of her fe-veral Pallengers of different Nations; The Patron is confe back to make his complaint to the French Conful-here, who has dispatched a Felucca to Marfeilles to give advice thereof to the Court of France

Madrid; July 6. The Spanifb Fleet failed from Cadiz the 20th of the laft Month, commanded by the Count d'Luilar, to meet the Gallions. The Chamber of the Contratation, and the Confulat of Seville have, upon the Orders that were lately fent to them from hence, reported, That they are of opinion that, the Galions defigned for the West Indies cannot undertake that voyage this year, without being exposed to great danger, because of the Season; which will be very far advanced before they can be ready to fail; fo that it's believed the Fleet will not depart this year. We have advice that the Count de Stirum was arrived at Gibraltar with the Squadron under his Command, and a great many Merchant Ships. The Envoy of Portugal made his publick Entry here the first Instant.

Danezick , July 5. The laft Letters from Poland told us, that the Forces of that Crown were at the General Rendezvous, to the number of 30000 Men; That those of Lithuania, which are about 15000, were expected there in few days, befides the Cojfacks, which may make about 10000 more : The King parted from Strye the 23 of the last Month, and we expect our next Letters will give us an account of the opening of the Campagne, which many believe will be with the fiege of Caminiec.

Ratisbonne, July 2, The Deputies of Bavaria, Suabra, Franconia, Oc. are still assembled at Aufburgh, but we do not hear they have yet concluded any thing. The last Letters from Hungary informed us, that the Count de Steinarr, who was fent with a detachement towards Hatwan, had let the Imperial Generals know, that the Garifon being reinforced, and they appearing relolved to defend the place, he did not think fit to attack it, unless he was supplied with more Men, and with the Cannon and Ammunition that was necessary for the forcing a Siege. The Turks when they aban-dored Peft, broke down only part of the Bridge over the Danube; on that which remains they have fince planted feveral pieces of Cannon to hinder the communication between the Imperialifts in Peft, and the Army before Buda; upon which, that Garifon has raifed a Battery to deftroy the reft of the Bridge.

Paris, July 24. The King went yesterday to fee the Troops of his Houshold, which are encamped in the Plain of Acheres. The Duke d'Atri is made Lieutenant-General of Champagne, in the place of the Duke de Roquelaure, who has refigned that Command. We have an account that the Maref-Tchat d'Estree retired from before Cadiz the 17th. of the last Month, with the Erench Fleet under his Command; That the next day the Duke de Mortemar separated from him off of Cape Spartell, and took his course towards the lifes Fromentiers, intending to go pover from thence to the coafts of Barbary with five men of War and the Galliots with Bombs ; and that the Chevalier de Toprofile arrived the 6th Inftant at Youion, with the reft' of the Ships of the Duke of Mortumar's Squadroir. The Daughin, and the Duke and Dutchefs of Orleans went last Sunday to Chaisy, where they were very magnificently entertained by Madamoifelle de Monpenjier. This Ambaffadors of Syam are expected here to Morrow. The Letters from the Imperial Camp beforé Buda of the 3d of this Month tell us, That the first Instant, the Auxiliary Troops of Suabra had their Pofts Higned them. The 2d, ano-

ther detachement of Cavalry was lent towards Alba Acgahis, and the Imperialists and Bayarians bat-tend the place from their several Batteries. The third the Forces of Brandenburgh arrived in the Camp, and took their Pofts, two Imperial Regirients, and the Troops of Franconia and Suabia being joyned with them; and a third Attack was affigned them between the Cafile and the Lower Town. The Bavarians had made a breach of 15 paces in the outward Wall, behind which there is another, with a great deal of earth thrown up behind it, and the Trenches were advanced within 125 Paces of the Body of the place; The Befieged do not make to vigorous a Defence as they did two years ago; the reafon of which is believed to be, that the Garifon is very weak, or under a great confternation and difcouragement; and indeet, all the prifoners and deferters declare unanimoufly, that there were not 7000 Soldiers in the place, and that they had no expectation of relief. The Elector of Bavaria observing that his Troops fullent very much by purfuing the Enemy too far when they made their Sallies, they having always Bodies of Referve, has cauled Pickaxes to be fluck into the earth, and has commanded his Troops not to pass beyond them. Orders have been fent to General Caprara who commands the Imperial Caralry near Alba Regalis, to detache 2000 Horfe towards Canis fin, to deftroy the Forage and Harveft on that lider And after this Expedition, its believed a ftrong detachement will be fent to make an attempt upon the Bridge of Effecke. From Venice we have advice of the taking of two important places, and of the defeat of 8000 Turks in the Morea, by the Forces of the Republick. The Seraikier advanced with 8000 Men to relieve New Na- vatino, upon which General Comingsmark leav-ing the Troops necessary to maintain the Siege, went to meet him, and after a Fight of two or three hours, entirely defeated him; of the Enemy 500 were killed, 800 taken prisoners, with 800 Tents, and all their Autillery, Ammunition, and Baggage: It's faid the Seraskier was cangeroufly wounded in the Head by the shot of a Pistol which the Prince de Turenne fired at him. Theré marched out of Navarino 3000 Men, of which 1500 were Soldiers, Horfe and Foot. The Venetians found 150 pieces of Cannon in the place (which is fortified with 6 Baftions, and is very confiderable for its Port and fituation) with a prodigious quantity of Ammunition and Provisions.
