LISBON.

The Board of Health have declared that the port of London is to be considered infected, and all other British ports suspected of infection with cholera.

Tunis

Ships arriving from ports where the cholera is known to exist, will not be admitted into the ports of Tunis unless they have undergone a quarantine of observation of 5 whole days, performed in a port where there is a Lazaretto, which must be authenticated by a bill of health.
