Brighton Improvement Commissioners and Municipal Corporation.
(Transfer to Municipal Corporation of powers and property of the Brighton Town Commissioners Improvement Act, 6th George 4th, chapter 179; and Pavilion Act, 13th Victoria, chapter 5).

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing session, for leave to bring in a Bill to transfer to the mayor, aldermen, and burgesses of the town of Brighton, the powers, rights, authorities, jurisdiction, and privileges, and the Pavilion, town-hall, markets, prisons, and other buildings, lands, hereditaments, goods, chattels, monies, property, and effects of the Commissioners acting under an Act, passed in the sixth year of the reign of King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act for the better regulating, paving, improving, and managing the town of Brighthelmston, in the county of Sussex, and the poor thereof;" and the (local and personal) Act, thirteenth Victoria, chapter 5, relating to the Royal Pavilion, at Brighton; and to subject the said mayor, aldermen, and burgesses to the duties, debts, and liabilities, or some of the duties, debts, and liabilities of the said Commissioners.

And it is also intended by the said Bill to empower the said mayor, aldermen, and burgesses to exercise and enjoy the powers, rights, privileges, jurisdiction, and authorities, so vested in them; and to carry into execution the objects and provisions of the Acts before-mentioned, or some of them, to continue or alter the rates, tolls, dues, and duties by those Acts authorized to be levied; to confer, vary, or extinguish exemptions from the payment thereof; and to confer, vary, or extinguish other rights and privileges, as by the said Acts or either of them are or is authorized.
