[The following Order in Council in substituted for an Order published on the 19th of September last.]

A^T the Court at Buchingham Palace, the 13th day of September, 1854,

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of his late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for rendering "more easy the taking the poll at county elections, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time, on petition from the Justices of any county, riding, parts, or division in England or Wales, in quarter sessions assembled, representing that the number of polling places for such county, riding, parts, or division is insufficient, and praying that the place or places mentioned in the said petition may be a polling place or polling places for the county, riding, parts, or division of the county within which such place or places is or are situate, to declare that any place or places men-tioned in the said petition shall be a polling place or polling places for that county, riding, parts, or division; and that the Justices of the Peace for such county, riding, parts, or division in quarter sessions or some special sessions assembled, as mentioned in the Act passed in the third year of the reign of His said late Majesty, intituled "An Act to settle and determine the divisions of counties and the limits of cities and boroughs in England and Wales, in so far as respects the election of members to serve in Parliament," shall, conformably to the said last-mentioned Act, divide such county, riding, parts, or division into convenient polling districts, and assign one of such districts to each polling place;

And whereas by another Act, passed in the session of Parliament, held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to limit the time for proceeding to elec-"tion in counties and boroughs in England and "Wales, and for polling at elections for the "Universities of Oxford and Cambridge, and for "other purposes;" it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time, hercafter, on petition from the justices in quarter sessions assembled of any county, riding, parts, or division of any county, other than any county of a city, or of a town in England and Wales, representing that it would be expedient that any polling place or places mentioned in the said petition should cease to be such, and that any other place or places mentioned in the said petition should be substituted in lieu thereof, and praying that such alteration and substitution might be made to declare that the said alteration and substitution shall be made in respect of all or any of the places mentioned in the said petition; and the said declaration shall be certified under the hand of one of the clerks in ordinary of Her Majesty's Privy Council, and when so certified shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall then be of the same force and effect as if the same had been expressly made by the authority of Parliament;

And whereas the justices of the peace of the county of Monmouth in quarter sessions assembled the twenty-sixth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, have presented their petition to Her Majesty, representing that the present polling places for the said county, that is to say: Abergavenny, Chepstow, Monmouth, Newport, Pontypool, the Rock Inn, in the parish of Bedwellty, and Usk, are insufficient in number, and that it would be expedient that the places hereinafter mentioned should be polling places for the said county, and also representing that it would be ex-pedient that the polling place called the Rock Inn, in the parish of Bedwellty, should cease to be a polling place; and that Newbridge, in the parish of Mynyddyslwyn, in the said county, should be a polling place in lieu thereof, and praying that Her Majesty would be pleased to declare that Castletown in the parish of Marshfield, Magor Croes-y-Keilog in the parish of Llanvrechva, Tredegar in the parish of Bedwellty, Ragland, Trelleck, and Cross Ash in the parishes of Lantilio Crossenny and Skenfreth, shall be polling places for the said county; and that the Rock Inn, in the parish of Bedwellty, shall cease to be a polling place for the said county; and that Newbridge, in the parish of Mynyddyslwyn, shall be substituted as a polling place in lieu thereof.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty having taken the said petition into consideration, doth by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, declare, order and direct that Castletown in the parish of Marshfield Magor, Croes-y-Keilog in the parish of Llanvrechva, Tredegar in the parish of Bedwellty, Ragland, Trelleck, and Cross Ash in the parishes of Lantillio Crossenny and Skenfreth, shall be polling places for the said county of Monmouth;
