H E 25th, the Enemy made a Sally upon the Bran-H B 25th, the Baemy made a Sally upon the Bran-denburgers with 1000 Men, but were beatenback; They returned preferintly alter, and killed 15 of our Men, and then retired again; Not long rafter they came out again, and skirmifhed in this manner by Retreats and Sallres for the fpace of four hours; on our fide a Lieutenant Colonel and 100 Mea were killed or wounded. The 26th, they made a Sally upon the Bavarians, but were repulled with Lofs. Yellerday about 5 in the Evening we made a General Aflault from the three Attacks, which lalted four hours with alt the Eveny imagi-Attacks, which laited four hours with all the Fury imagi-nable, the Turks inferred us to advance to the Palifadoes, and then fprang feveral Mines, which deitroyed a great ma-ny of our Men; But this bindered us not from purfuing the Affault, and at lait we lodged our felves fo well on the two Towers, and that we longed our leves to wen on the two Towers, and the Courtin, that it is not in the Enemies power to dillodge dos; The Bavarian did the like on their fide, and took three pieces of Cannon, and a Mortar. In this Action we had near 3000 Men killed or wounded, and divers Officers

The Signal was given about 4 in the aff eronon by 12 pieces of Cannon pointed against the Tuwn on the fide of Pell, whereupon, at the Buke of Lorrain's Attack, 40 Grenadiers, with a Caprain, Lieutenant, and a Serjeant at the Head of them, followed with 50 Fulfilters, 50 men arm-ed with Sickles, and 100 with P.ckares, Shorels, and Rags of World, under the Ofders of two Captains, two Lieu-tenants, and other inferior Officers, advanced towards the Tower or Rondel on the Right, fupported by 200 Mussion tiprs, with 2 Captains, 2 Lieutenants, and other inferior Of-ficers, this Attack being commanded by the Prince of Neu-bourg, Great Mafter of the Teutonick Order, and underthim by the Marquis de Negrelli General of Battalia, Colonel Keth, Lieutenant Colonel the Batron de Reder, and the Ma-jor of the Regiment of Staremberg; In the middle towards the Courtin 50 Grenadiers, 100 Fulciers, with a smany mea armed with Sickles, and 150 with Shryels, Pickares, and other Infiruments proper to make Lodgments, fupported by other infruments proper to make Lodgments, lipported by 200 Mulqueteers, with their feveral Officers at the Head of them, begau the Attack under the direction of the Lieurenant General the Count de Souches, being affilded by Major General the Count de Souches, being affilded by Major General Diepedal, Colonel Ogingen, Lieutenant Colonel the Count de Jorger, and the Major of the Regiment of Croy; There were polited 1200 Men for a Referve in a Bottom near the Foot of the Breach under the Command of Major Genethe Poot of the Breach under the Command of Major Gene-ral Dingen, who were to advance by Files to fill the places of the killed or wounded, and all the relf of the Infantry were ordered to advance as there was occasion, and the other Ge-neral Officers were polled infeveral Places, fo as that they adgit bell petform their foreral parts; and fee the Orders that were given put in execution. The Brandenburghers who attackt the Rondel on the Left, were difpoled in the fame manner as were the Imperialities on the Right, and Supported by Bodies of Referve. The Heydukes commanded by Licu-tentant General Javarin made a faile Attack on the fide of the Water, where a Breach had been made in the Wall, by the blowing up of the Magazine. In this maaner the Officers and Soldiers with great Order and Courage mounted the Brea-ches, our Canaon, Bombs, Carcafles, Grenadoes, and small ches, our Canaon, Bombs, Carcalles, Grenadoes, and small Shot playing at the fame time upon the Bnemy, which they returned with a thower of Arrows, Darts, Fire-balls, Gre-nadoes and Stones thot out of Mortars, and other Machines which they threw from the top of the Breaches . The Energy (for any 5 Mines or Fougades at the Foot of the Breach, and 4 above requiring geat Execution, which put our men twice or thrice into great showler; whereupon the Doke of shorperim advanced himfelf with his Sword in his hand to the foot of the Breach, to re-aminate their Valor, where he was lightly hurt on the Leg with a Stone, and feweral were hilled above.

him; Our Men feeling their General to near them, took new Courage, and at last forced the Turks to abandon the Great Tower and the Courtin, and began to lodge themfelives thereis The Brandenburgbers having in the manner given on otheir fide all pollible proofs of their Courage and Bravery, made, thetifelves, Matters of the Tower on the Left. The Enemy en-deavor'd to regain thele Polisi, firing very thick upon us with Small-fhot, Grenadoes, Arrows, Fire-balls, and other Sal-phurous Hire-works, which they threw among our Men, but we'remained Millers of them; Never was there a more ob-flinate Defence, which laited about 3 hours, but the greatelt mildhief the Enemy didus was with Stones that out of Mor-tars; and with their Mines, and Bags of Powder, which they fee Fire to when they retired from any Polt. We have not yet been able to make an Eraft Lift of the killed and wounded; The molt confiderable were Monfieur d'Artein; Adjutant General to the Duke of Lorrain, killed; the Artillery; Major General Diependal, Major General Dingen, the Barond'Alti, the Count de Redet; the Count Schlik, Baron Grera, the Serjeant Major of Staremberg, and Serjeant Major Pini wounded. Of the Brandenburghers the Count de Dona, and Serjeant Major Marwirg were killed, and a Prince of Gourland dangeroully wounded of the Jim-periahlfs and Brandenburghers usar 2000 were killed and wounded in this Attack.
