And whereas by certain other Acts made and passed in the thirteenth, in the fourteenth, and in the sixteenth years of the reign of Her Majesty, the provisions of the said recited Act have been amended and extended :

And whereas it hath been represented that it would be of advantage to the public that the County Court of Yorkshire now holden at Boston, should be holden at Wetherby, instead of at Boston : Her Majesty, having taken the premises into consideration, is thereupon pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the first day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, the County Court now holden by the name of "The County Court of Yorkshire holden at Boston," shall be holden by the name of "The County Court of Yorkshire holden at Wetherby;" and the said Court now holden at Boston shall be holden at Wetherby instead of at Boston.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the tenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled "An Act for the more easy recovery of small "debts and demands in England," it is, among other things, enacted, that it should be lawful for Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that the said Act be put in force in such county or counties as to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, should seem fit, and to divide the whole or part of any such county (including all counties of cities and counties of towns, cities, boroughs, towns, ports, and places, liberties and franchises therein contained or thereunto adjoining) into districts ; and to order that the County Court should be holden for the recovery of debts and demands, under the said Act, in each of such districts ; and, from time to time, to alter such districts as to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, should seem fit; and, from time to time, with the advice aforesaid, to declare by what name, and in what towns and places, the County Court should be holden in each district :

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by an Order in Council, of the ninth day of March one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, to order that the said Act be put in force in the counties and places therein specified, and the same was put in force accordingly.

And whereas it hath been represented, that it would be to the advantage of the public, if the following alteration were made in certain of the districts of the Courts, as specified or set forth in the aforesaid Order :

Her Majesty, having taken the premises into consideration, is thereupon pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the thirtyfirst day of February, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five,—

The parishes of Box and Colerne, now in the district of the County Court of Wiltshire, holden at Chippenham, shall be in the district of the County Court of Somersetshire, holden at Bath.

The parishes of Sarnesfield and Kinnersley, now in the district of the County Court of Herefordshire, holden at Hereford, shall be in the district of the County Court of Herefordshire, holden at Kington.

The parishes of Pedmore and Hagley, now in the district of the County Court of Worcestershire, holden at Bromsgrove, shall be in the district of the County Court of Worcestershire, holden at Stourbridge.

The parishes of Tibberton, Hindlip, Warndon, and Claines (except the township of Whistones), now in the district of the County Court of Worcestershire, holden at Droitwich, shall be in the district of the County Court of Worcestershire, holden at Worcester.

The parishes of White Ladies Aston, Bredicott, Churchill, Broughton - Hackett, Norton-juxta-Kempsey, and Spetchley, now in the district of the County Court of Worcestershire, holden at Pershore, shall be in the district of the County Court of Worcestershire, holden at Worcester.

The parishes of Powick and Kempsey, now in the district of the County Court of Worcestershire, holden at Upton-on-Severn, shall be in the district of the County Court of Worcestershire, holden at Worcester.

The parishes of Caxton, Croxton, Eltisley, Great Gransden and Little Gransden, now in the district of the County Court of Cambridgeshire, holden at Cambridge, shall be in the district of the County Court of Huntingdonshire, holden at Saint Neots.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act " to make further provision for the burial of the " dead in England beyond the limits of the " Metropolis," it is enacted that in case it appear to Her Majesty in Council, upon the petition of the Town Council of any borough, stating that an Order in Council has been made for closing all or any of the burial-grounds of one or more parishes being wholly or partly within such borough, that there is difficulty or inconvenience in providing under the powers of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the " burial of the dead in England beyond the limits " of the Metropolis, and to amend the Act con-" cerning the burial of the dead in the metropolis," requisite places of burial for the inhabitants of such parish or parishes, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that powers shall be vested in the Council of such borough for providing such places of burial under the provisions of this Act : provided always that notice of such petition and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and in one of the newspapers usually circulating in such borough, one month at least before such petition is so considered;
