the part of the enemy. The weather has been very bad, and the camp and the country are in consequence of the rain in a most unsatisfactory

The men are, however, endeavouring, and with some success, to shelter themselves with the stones that are found in the vicinity of the encampment, and every effort is making to provide them with the materials for hutting themselves, but the condition of the roads render this a matter of extreme difficulty.

It is gratifying to me to be able to assure you, that, notwithstanding their privations, their expo-sure to the weather, and the constant labour required of them, they exhibit the same cheerfulness, the same ardour in the discharge of their duty as they have manifested throughout the extensive operations in which they have been

engaged.
I inclose the return of casualties up to the

26th instant inclusive.

The defences of the Inkerman position, notwithstanding the frequent interruptions from the weather are making considerable progress.
