

purposes, and that such proposed district should be named 'The District Chapelry of Mount Pellon,' and that the boundaries thereof should be those hereinafter mentioned; that is to say:

"Commencing at the junction of a stream of water (dividing the townships of Halifax and Ovenden) with the Hebble Brook, near to the Shroggs, in the said township of Ovenden, marked A on the map or plan [hereunto annexed, and proceeding from thence to the junction of the road near Shroggs Bottom; thence along the middle of the road to Wheatley Edge, in a north-westerly direction through Wheatley and along the middle of Wheatley-lane to the junction of Wheatley-lane Ends; thence along the middle of Boy-lane to Riding Bridge, and along the middle of Riding-lane to the junction of the roads northward of Lee House; from thence westerly along a stream of water through Ramsden Wood to its junction with a footpath leading from Highfield-lane to Mount Pleasant; thence in a south-westerly direction along a footpath to its junction with the Parliamentary boundary of the borough of Halifax near to Mon Bottom; thence south-easterly along the Parliamentary boundary of the borough of Halifax to its junction with a lane leading into High-road Well; then southerly along the middle of that lane to High-road Well, and from thence easterly and south-easterly along such Parliamentary boundary to West End; thence easterly along the middle of Hopwood-lane to Kingston, from Kingston by an imaginary line northerly to Gibbet-lane at its junction with Thrum Hall-lane; thence northerly along the middle of Thrum Hall-lane to its junction with Hanson-lane; thence easterly along the middle of Hanson-lane to its junction with a lane leading from Hanson-lane (near to the Halifax Water Works Supply Reservoirs); thence northerly along the middle of such lane to the Asps in Pellon-lane, and from thence by an imaginary line northerly to the point marked A as aforesaid, where the boundary line of the said district chapelry of Mount Pellon commenced, and as the same is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed and thereon coloured pink.

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent that it also appears to them to be expedient that banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, should be solemnized or performed in Christ Church, at Mount Pellon aforesaid, and that the fees to arise therefrom should be paid or belong to the minister or incumbent of such church for the time being.

"That the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Thomas, Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon, has been obtained thereto, as required by the Acts and sections hereinbefore mentioned, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this representation.

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church, called Christ Church, situate at Mount Pellon, in the parish of Hali-

fax be accordingly made, and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns, and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, in the said church, and the fees to arise therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased to direct that this Order, be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Ripon.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act of Parliament, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act passed in the last session of Parliament, for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous parishes," as enlarged by the third section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the second and third years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the assignment of ecclesiastical districts to churches or chapels augmented by the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and for other purposes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council, a representation, bearing date the ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, in the words following; viz:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent that having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Coppenhall, in the county and diocese of Chester, it appears to them to be expedient that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church, called Christ Church, situate at Crewe, in the said parish of Coppenhall, under and by virtue of the power or authority contained in the sixteenth section of an Act of Parliament, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act passed in the last session of Parliament for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous parishes,' as enlarged by the third section of an Act of Parliament, passed in the second and third years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to make better provision for the assignment of ecclesiastical districts to churches or chapels augmented by the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and for other purposes,' and that such proposed district should be named or called 'The District Chapelry of Christ Church Crewe,' and that the boundaries thereof should be those hereinafter mentioned; that is to say:

"Commencing at Liverpool Bridge, on the north-east, and proceeding from thence, westerly, along Earle-street to Coppenhall-street; then northerly along the middle of the latter street to Victoria-street, and then proceeding westerly along the middle of that street and the lane to Wistaston, southerly, as far as the north-west angle of the field, No. 231 on the Tithe communication Map of the said parish of Coppenhall; and then proceeding southerly along the footpath run-
