Madrid , Aug. 15. H E Count d'Aquilar, Admiral of the Spamifb Fleet, has fent an Officer hither, to acquaint this Court that he had met the Galions, fo that we expect every hour to hear of their arrival in Cadiz, or in fome other Port of this Kingdom. The laft week arrived here an Exprefs from Rome, being difpatched by the Count de Borromeo, Ambaffador of this Crown, to give his Catholick Majefty an account of the difficulties that had happed about prefenting the Genet on St. Peter's Eve ; He was fent back with the King's Orders upon this Incident. From the Polith Camp at Tlumaes on the Frontiers of Moldavia, fuly 18. Our march has been, hindered for fome days by a difference arifen between Mohila and Appalti, who command 2 Bodies of Colfacks; It went fo far, That they not only fought themfelves, but had almost engaged their Troops in their Quarrel, which being at laft ended by the King's Interpolition, the Army will decamp this day, and enter into Moldavia. The King has written to the Hospodars of that Countrey and of Valachta, to have their Forces in a readiness to join him, as they have promifed they shall do. We have Advice that Sultan Galga who had paffed through Valachta with a Body of Tartars in his march towards Hungary, is recalled by the Cham to defend his Countrey againft the Molcovites.

The M Covites have published at Smolensko, with much Solemnity, the Treaty of Alliance lately concluded between the Czars and this Crown; Their Forces advance towards the Boriftenes in a very confiderable Body, and will, doubtlefs, give the Tartars a great diversion. The King of Poland marches towards the Frontiers of Moldavia, the Hospodars of that Countrey and of Valachia have, we are told, promifed to fend 14000 Men to join the Army of this Crown. We are expecting the Return of our Ambasfadors from Molcovy.

From the Imperial Camp before Buda, August 15. The 13th, towards Evening, the Duke of Lorrain, having received Advice that the Bnemy, to the Number of 40000 Men, approached towards our Camp, with a defign to force one of our Quarters, and to put fome Succors into the Town, caufed, with concert of the Elector of Bavaria, all the Horle and Foot to march out of the Lines, except 20000 Men that were left to continue the Attacks, and guard the feveral Polts and Avenues of the Camp, and at the fame time the Commiflary General diffributed to the Cavalty, Oats and Forage for four days; The Army was drawn up in order of Battel, the Count de Dunewaldt, General of the Horle, comunanding the Left Wing, compoled of the Impetial Regiments of Caprara; Palti, Taff, Lodron; Neuburg,

Furftemberg, Stirum, Serau and Schultz, with 8 Squadrons for Hullbra, and Major-General Heuller the Right, compo-led of une-fame number of Regiments, as well Imperialills as Bavatiats and Satons, and 4000 Heydukes and Holfars being appointed for the Vanguate The 14th, by break of day, we were informed that the Enemy had formed a Body of 4000 Janilaries, and assumany Spahi's, of their belt Troops, who begun about 5 in the morning to paß behind the Hills, making a Meen as if they would approach in feveral Parties, by the fame wayes which they took ro put Succors into the Town two years ago, while the main of their Army deficended in great Bodies into the Plain. The Duke of Lorrain phierving the Enemies motion, and lind-ing by the Noile he heard, that the Heydukes and Huffars of the Vanguard were engaged with the 8000 Jani-faries and Spahi's before-mentioned, ordered the Right Wing to advance to their Affithance; The Eight was there very tharp, and the Succefs dolbtful, till Major-General Heufler and General Petnehafi earnie in with the Troops of their Divident Heuduker, who though that Heuller and General Petnehafi can'e in with the Proops of their Divifions to Support the Heydukes, who though they fought very bravely, we being attacked in Front and Flank by the Turks exceeding them in Number by one half, were forced to give way, but upon this Succor, the Fight wes vigoroully renewed by the Christians, who charged the Enemy with that Courage, that the Spahi's not being able to bear their Shoek, fell into great Confusion, and abandon-ed the Janifaries; Thefe were provided each man with 3 Gre-nadoes, and with Pickares, Shovels, and other Infruments, to level our Works. After this, the Turks cauled to or 12000 Mear to advance againft our Leff Wing, communded 12000 Men to advance against our Left Wing, commanded by General Dunewaldt, who thought fit to more a little, that he might give time to the Troops of the Right Wing, who returned from the Defeat of the Troops defigned 40 fuccor the Town, to retake their Ground, after which the fuccor the Town, to retake their Ground, after which the whole Army advanced towards the Rnemy, who thereapon retired to their main Body; On Troops purfued them, and sk rm fining with the Spahi's that were left to cover their Retreat, killed 142, and took 27 Prifoners, and would have gone farther, had not the Duke of Lorrain commanded General Dunewaldt to return, and join the main Body. The Night coming on, the Duke of Lorrain drew the whole Army again within the Lines, and the feveral Regiments returned to their former Polts.
