

CONTRACT FOR PEARL AND SCOTCH BARLEY.

THE Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland do hereby give notice, that, on Tuesday the 6th March next, at one o'clock, they will be ready to treat with such persons as may be willing to contract for supplying and delivering into the Medical Stores, at Her Majesty's Victualling Yard, at Deptford, all such quantities of

THE Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland do hereby give notice, that, on Monday the 5th March next, at one o'clock, they will be ready to treat with such persons as may be willing to contract for supplying and delivering into Her Majesty's Victualling Stores at Deptford, Gosport and Plymouth, the under-mentioned articles, viz.:

Peas, 500 quarters, Deptford; half to be delivered in three weeks, and the remainder in three weeks afterwards, or earlier if preferred by the party tendering.

Soap, 50 tons, Deptford; half to be delivered in three weeks, and the remainder in three weeks afterwards, or earlier if preferred by the party tendering.

Lemon Juice, 2,500 gallons, Gosport; 2,500 gallons, Plymouth; half of each to be delivered in three weeks, and the remainder in three weeks afterwards, or earlier if preferred by the party tendering.

Lemon Juice Bottles, 10,000 number, Gosport; 10,000 number, Plymouth; half of each to be delivered in three weeks, and the remainder in three weeks afterwards, or earlier if preferred by the party tendering.

Tenders may be made for the whole, or any portion of any of the articles.

Their Lordships reserve to themselves the power, when the tenders are opened, of contracting either for the whole, or for such part thereof only as they may deem fit, or for a greater quantity, or of not contracting for any; and also an unlimited power of selection.

Samples of the peas (not less than 2 quarts), of the soap (not less than a bar), must be produced by the parties tendering, and samples of the bottles may be seen at the said office, and at the Victualling Yards, at Gosport and Plymouth.

The samples produced by persons whose tenders are not accepted, are requested to be taken away by them immediately after the contracts have been decided.

No tender will be received unless made on the printed form provided for the purpose, and which may be obtained on application to the said Office, or at the Victualling Yards at Gosport and Plymouth, or to Commander Bevis, conducting the Packet Service at Liverpool, or to the Collector of Customs at Bristol.

The conditions of the revised contracts, to which particular attention is called, may be seen at the said Office, at the Victualling Yards at Gosport and Plymouth, and at Liverpool and Bristol.

No tender will be received after one o'clock on the day of treaty, and it will not be required that the party tendering, or an agent, on his behalf
