IT is hereby notified, that the Right Honourable the Earl of Clarendon, K.G., Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received a Despatch from Rear-Admiral Sir Edmund Lyons, G.C.B., commanding Her Majesty's Naval Forces in the Black Sea, dated "Royal Albert," off Sevastopol, 20th February, 1855, and addressed to the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, announcing that, in conjunction with Vice-Admiral Bruat, commanding the French

Squadron in the Black Sea, he had, on and from the 18th of February last, raised the Blockade of the Danube, which was established on and from the 1st day of June, 1854, and which was notified in the London Gazette of the 13th of June, 1854, and which has since been duly maintained.

It is hereby notified, that the cruizers of the Allied Fleets are, and will remain, stationed off the Mouths of the Danube, to capture any vessels laden with contraband of war destined for the use of the enemy.
