NOTICE TO MARINERS.

Beeves Rock Lighthouse, River Shannon.

THE Port of Dublin Corporation hereby give notice that a Lighthouse has been erected on the Beeves Rock, in the River Shannon, from

which a light will be exhibited on the night of the 14th day of May next, 1855, and thereafter will be lighted during every night from sunset to sunrise.

Specification given of the position of the Rock, and appearance of the Light, by Mr. Halpin, Superintendent of Lighthouses.

Beeves Rock Lighthouse is erected at the south-west side of the Beeves tidal rock, in Lat. 52° 39' 0" N., and Long. 9° 1' 18" W., bearing

From Foynes Island (north shore), E. $\frac{3}{4}$ S., distant 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ nautic miles.

From Herring Rocks (north point), N.N.E., distant 0 $\frac{3}{4}$ nautic miles.

From Carrig Keal, W. $\frac{3}{4}$ N., distant 4 nautic miles.

The light will be a *fixed light*, of the natural appearance—*bright*, as seen from the main channel
