The Letters from Lemberg of the 1th Initiant fay, the King of Poland had paffed the Niefer; and that his defign feemed to be upon, Bialagrod and Budrial, by the taking of which places the Polith Territories will be fecured againft the Incurfions of the Tartars, and the Garifon of Commerc cut off from the Supplies they nawreceive Fond that fide. The Queen of Poland was feturned to Sniatin, and intended to go from thence to Samber, to remain there during the Campagne, There are other Letters which fpeak of the deteat of 3000 Tartars by a Detachement which the King had fent out upon the notice he had of the Enemies march, but tell us no Particulars. The lait Advices from Molfon faid that the Czars were drawing all fheir Forces together, infending fo employ at leaft Soodo Men in feveral Bodies againft the Tartars.

Ratisbonne', Aug. 25. We have advice from Hungary, by the way of Viennia, that the Duke of Lorrain had in vain endeavoured to engage the Grand Vilier to a Battle, whole defign feemed to be to weary out the Christians by giving them continual Alarms, and to try with finall Bodies to break through their Camp, and to put Succors into the Town? This he attempted on the 14th of the last month, detaching 10000 chosen men to attack the Elector of Bavaria's Quarter, while with his main Body he faced the Imperial Army; but the Duke of Larr. in having notice of it, ordered part of his Right Wing to march towards this Detachement, which they did, and charged them with that vigor, that the Turks were routed and put to flight, 3000 being flain, and 400 taken, with 8 pieces of Cannon, and 50 Colours and Standards; The 20th the Enemy madeanother attempt, and with fome better fuccefs, for 4000 Janifaries and Spahi's having for-ced the Out-guards to retire, broke into the Imperial Camp, and though Major-General Heufley made heat against them with several Squadrons of Horfe, and yeat them back, yet during the first diff order fome hen got into the Town, their number

is variously reported, fo that we mult expect another Poft to be certainly informed: As to the Siege these Letters fay, the *Imperialifi* shad feveral times burnt the Palifadors the Befieged had planted on the Breaches, which the Enemy had as often repaired; That the Christians had thereupon raifed a Battery of nine pieces of Cannon, with which they played upon the Palifadoes; and that at the fame time they were preparing feveral new Mines.

Gottorp, Aug. 27. The Danish Forces quartered in Holffgin are on their march, and we are told that a great many, Bombs have been fent from Pinnezburg to the Hitler Scans. The King of Denmark will be this day at Pinnenburg, and from thence Kis believed will go to Altena; His Majefty has fent the Heer Van Haxbaufen to the Duke of Zell. The Forces of Lunenburg, Hanouer, and Wolfemburg do likewile move; it's faid they are 12000 ftrong

Graningen, Aug. 27. On Sunday laft there and peared a Fleet of Ships off of Delfziel, which pit out the Colours of leveral Nations, the Governar by the plate not knowing who they were, and fearing they might have a defign upon Embden, fent thither a Detachement of his Garifon; The next day the Regiment of Colonel Loifekot was fent to Embden from hence, and Prince Cafimir of Naffau arrived here with a Regiment of Horfe and another of Foot, and other Troops were ordered hicker from Swoll, Kampen and Deventer.

Amsterdam, Sept. g. At the departure of the laft Letters from Himburgh, which were dated the 30th of the laft Month, the Magiftiates and Burghers of that City were in a great perplexity, occasion-ed by the Summons they had received from the King of Denmark to do Homage to his Majelty, and to pay him 400000 Crowns, and by the approach of the Danish Forces, which had posted themfelves within a mile of the Town, having with them feveral pieces of Cannon and Mortare, and the advice they had, that more Troops were marching from their quarters in Holftein to joyn them. The Burghers had been affembled, and had refolved not to comply with the King of Depmark's demand, but to defend themselves, and to have recourse to the Elector of Brandenburgh and Princes of Lunenburgh for affiftance, which the Minister of the latter refiding at Hamburg, had on the part of his Mafter affured them of and accordingly on the 30th 2000 Lunenburgers entred into the Territories of that City called the Four Lands, 500 Hamburgeis that were posted there retiring at the fame time into the Town; and 3000 Men of the Duke of Hanotier's Troops were likewife marching to their fuc-cor. The King of Denmark was himself at Alternay his Men of War had taken and carried into Glacke ftadt feveral Ships belonging to Hamburgh. They write

A Fleet of Ships which were faid to be Danes appearing the laft week on the Eems, greatly alarmed the Frieflanders, and feveral Regiments were immediately ordered to march to Delfziel and Embden, upon which places it was imagined they had fome defign, but these fears did not continue, the departure of the faid Ships from off that Coaft putting an end to them. Colonel Golon, a very eminent Ingenier, parted from hence the laft week for Hungary to ferve in the Imperial Army; The Emperor gives him 12000 Crowns, and the States if he milcarry in that Service have promifed his Wife and Children a yearly Pention of 4000 Gil-The Heer Van Dieft and the Sieht Raule, the ders. Brandenbogb Ministers, are returned lither from Chues. Prince Philip of Brandenburgh is expected here the next weeks

From the Imperial Camp before Buda, August 23 The 20th inftant at break of day 4000 Turks, among which were 2000 Janifaries, all on Horfe back, appeared in the Valley of St. Paul, Who fell upon our advanced Guards with that fory that they were forced to retire, but being feconded by fome Squadrons Commanded by the Generals Caprara and Heufler, they returned upon the Turk's and put them to flight with the flaughter of above 'goo of them, during this action 300 of the Janilaries having quitted their Horfes paffed our Lines, and though they were purfued by General Heufler, and that our feveral Guards and the Musketeers in our works fired upon them, yet about 150 (but almost one half of these wounded) got into the Town, the reft being killed or taken prisoners; In this occasion we loft eight Men, besides some wounded, of which number is Major-General Heufler. The 21 we continued to play with our Cannon and Bombes from the three Attacks, and to fill the Ditches with that fueces, that on the Elector of Bavaria's fide, all things were ready for an Affault, The 22 the Befieged made a Sally upon the Bavarians, and beat them from fome of their Works, but our Men not only regained their Polls, but cut offall the Furks they found in them. The 23.the Elector of Bavaria made an affault upon the Califle, the Detachments appointed for the Service, mounted the Breach though defended by the Turks with great obtiinacy, and forced the Enemies retrenchments, and all their other polts on that fide, and remained absolute Masters of the Castle, most of the Turks that were posted there being killed, and the reft retiring behind the ruines of the Houfer which our Cannon and Bombs had beaten down, but we quickly chafed them them from thence into the Town, which is only feparated from the Caftle by an old weak Wall. In this Aflault we loft not i oo men tand few Officers or Volontiers of note. Wg found in the Calille feveral peices of Cannon and Mortars but difinounted, the Enemy having burnt the Carriages. This day a Turk was taken with a Letter from the Balla of Buda to the Vifier, wherein he preffes him for fpeedy fuccor, for that he is not in a condition to defend the place three days longer.

. Vienna, Aug ft 29. This day at Noon arrived here an Express from before Buda, with advice, that the Bavarians had on the 23 initiant made themfelves Mafters of the Caftle with the lofs only of 60 men & That the Elector of Bavaria had afterwards fent feveral Batallions from his Attack to that of the Duke of Lorrain, where they were preparing to make likewife an Affault, while the Bavarians gave a falle Alarm on the fide of the Cafile The Turkifh Army was encamped about 3 milesfrom Buda. The Grand Visier had cauled the Balla, and near 100 Officers that commanded the

Detachement on the 14th, to be ftrangled. Briffels, Sept. 6. The laft Letters from Vienna tell us, that the 20th the Turks made another attempt to fuccor Budg, and that about 150 Men got into the Town ; that the 22 the Befieged made afurious Sally, and forced the Bavarians from their Trenches; but that these foon regained their Pofts, and beat back the Enemy with great loss; That the 23 the Bavarians itormed the Caltle, and made themfelves Mafters of it. And that General Scherffenburg was expected the next day in the Camp with fix Regiments of Foot, and as many of Horse. The Letters from Venice of the 24th past fay, That Captain-General Morofini having reloved in a great Council of War to beliege Nappli de Romania, failed the 27th of July from Modon with the whole Fleet, which had on board 24000 Land-Men. 4

Pertfimuth, Aug. 31. Whitchall, Sept. 1. This Evening arrived an Express to the Spanish Ambaffador, which went immediately forward to Winthfor, with the news that Budy was taken by Storm the 26th of the laft thouth, New Scile; The Imperialists, Bavarians and Brandenburghers entring the Town at the fame time at their feveral Attacks, and putting all to the Sword.
