Dantice, Aug. 22. The Letters from Lemberg of the 17th Initiant fay, the King of Poland had passed the Niester, and that his design seemed to be upon Biaddood and Budrial, by the taking of which places the Polish Territories will be secured against the Incursions of the Tartars, and the Garison of Canimes cut off stom the Supplies they naw receive from that side. The Queen of Polish was settle to Statin, and intended to go from thence to Sambor, to remain there during the Campagne, There are other Letters which speak of the deteat of 3000 Tartars by a Detachement which the King had sent out upon the notice he had of the Enemies march, but tell us no Particulars. The last Advices from Moscow said that the Czars were drawing all their Forces together, intending so employ at least 2000 Men in several Bodies against the Tartars.

Ratisbonne, Aug. 25. We have advice from Hungary, by the way of Vienta, that the Duke of Lorrain had in vain endeavoured to engage the Grand Visier to a Battle, whose design seemed to be to weary out the Christians by giving them continual Alarms, and to try with small Bodies to break through their Camp, and to put Succors into the Town. This he attempted on the 14th of the last month, detaching 10000 chosen men to attack the Elector of Bavaria's Quarter, while with his main Body he faced the Imperial Army; but the Duke of Larr. In having notice of it, ordered part of his Right Wing to march towards this Detaclement, which they did, and charged them with that vigor, that the Turks were routed and put to flight; 3000 being slain, and 400 taken, with 8 pieces of Cannon, and 50 Colours and Standards; The 20th the Enemy madeanother attempt, and with some better success, for 4000 Janisaries and Spahi's having forced the Out-guards to retire, broke into the Imperial Camp, and though Major-General Heuflet made heat against them with several Squadrons of Horse, and test them back, yet during the first disorder some hen got into the Town, their number

Gottorp, Aug. 27. The Danish Forces quartered in Holffgin, are on their march, and we are told that a great many Bombs have been sent from Pinnenburg to the Hieler Scans. The King of Denmark will be this day at Pinnenburg, and from thence is believed will go to Altena; His Majesty has sent the Heer Van Haxhausen to the Duke of Zell. The Forces of Lunenburg, Hanouer, and Wolfemburge do likewise move; it's said they are 12000 strong

Graningen, Ang. 27. On Sunday last there are peared a Fleet of Ships off of Delfziel, which put out the Colours of several Nations, the Governor be the place not knowing who they were, and searing they might have a delign upon Embden, sent thicker a Detachement of his Garison: The next day the Regiment of Colonel Losseknot was sent to Embden from hence, and Prince Casimer of Nashau arrived here with a Regiment of Hosse and another of Foot, and other Troops were ordered his er from Swoll, Kampen and Deventer.

Amsterdam, Sept. g. At the departure of the last Letters from Hamburgh, which were dated the 30th of the last Month, the Magistiates and Burghers of that City were in a great perplexity occasioned by the Summons they had received from the King of Denmark to do Homage to his Majelty, and to pay him 400000 Crowns, and by the approach of the Danish Forces, which had posted themselves within a mile of the Town, having with them feveral pieces of Cannon and Mortars, and the advice they had, that more Troops were marching from their quarters in Holftein to joyn them. The Burghers had been affembled, and had refolved not to comply with the King of Denmark's demand, but to defend themselves, and to have recourse to the Elector of Brandenburgh and Princes of Lunenburgh for affiftance, which the Minister of the latter refiding at Hamburg, had on the part of his Mafter affured them of and accordingly on the 30th 2000 Lunenburgers entred into the Territories of that City called the Four Lands, 500 Hamburgers that were posted there retiring at the same time into the Town; and 3000 Men of the Duke of Hanouer's Troops were likewise marching to their succept. The King of Denmark was himself at Alterna; his Men of War had taken and carried into Glacks stadt several Ships belonging to Hamburgh, They
