Casks, 4,500 number; half to be delivered in one month, and the remainder in one month afterwards, or earlier if preferred by the party tendering.

Tenders may be made for the whole or any portion of the casks; and their Lordships reserve

to themselves the power, when the tenders are opened, of contracting either for the whole, or for such part thereof only as they may deem fit, or for a greater quantity, or of not contracting for any.

Patterns may seen at Her Majesty's Victualling Yard at Deptford.

No tender will be received unless made on the printed form provided for the purpose, and which may be obtained on application at the said Office.

The description of the Casks, and the conditions of the revised contract, to which particular attention is called, may be seen at the said Office.

No tender will be received after one o'clock on the day of treaty, and it will not be required that the party tendering, or an agent on his behalf, should attend at the Office on the day of contract, as the result of the offer received from each person will be communicated to him and his proposed sureties in writing.
